About the introduction of the keyboard into the Freshmen Ask Ray Brown

I met the guys, Ross, Bob, Ken, and Bill, in Florida in 1972. They were booked in for three nights and I led the house band.....bass, piano, drums, and guitar.

While talking with Ross at the gig, I mentioned that I had been a Freshmen fan since I was about 12 years old and my dream was to sing those kinds of arrangements.

I wrote all the vocal arrangements for my group, but rarely did I come even remotely close to the quality of the likes of Ken Albers, Dick Reynolds, and Pete Rugulo.

Anyhow, I told Ross that if Bill ever wanted to get off the road, consider me and a keyboard. Ross said that the idea was not that far fetched because the guitar needed to be retuned two or three times during each show, and the guys had talked about how to deal with that problem.

About nine months later I got a phone call from Ross, asking if I wanted to take Bill's place. Bill wanted to go home and take care of Sue who, even then, was in failing health.

I said "How much do I have to pay you?" Anyhow, Ken started sending me arrangements to learn and a couple of months later I visited the guys on the road (I believe in Ohio) and we tried a couple of songs to see if the piano suited them. It did.

Bill wished me well and started making plans to leave the group. The end of the year 1972 was the target date.

I invested in a Farfista keyboard, which was state of the art at that time. In January of 1973 I was in place in LA and we spent two weeks in heavy rehearsal, then hit the road. The first gig was in Titusville, PA. I guess they figured that if I didn't work out, at least not that many people would know about it.

It seemed to work out ok and I spent the happiest four plus years of my musical life traveling the world and singing those wonderful chords.

BOOKING THE FOUR FRESHMEN by Dick Baldwin, FFS President For The Best Jazz Support Group In The Land!!

Some confusion remains about getting the Four Freshmen into the best venues around America. Here's a capsule to move the procedure along, resulting in a possible booking in your area. The suggestion derives directly from our management team in Valencia, CA.

International Ventures Incorporated (IVI) is ready to cooperate with us. The primary connection should be between a venue or performing/theatre site and IVI. Make your local contact with a potential venue and promote the current Freshmen to the degree you are comfortable with. Advise the venue rep or officer to contact IVI directly (661-259-4500). Here's the inside - let the pros work with the pros. IVI will talk talent fee, travel, lodging, and other particulars with the potential contractor.

The advice is not to get involved in any of those details. Chances are you'll be wrong or misleading. No two "gigs" are ever the same. Often dates are connected geographically - sensible.

The FFS is fortunate to be involved with a major, established professional agency, adept at mixing detail with good business.

Four Freshmen #22 are in capable, professional leadership. Let's assist management. The method makes the way! Private parties are private and require special handling with IVI.

FFS MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASE

Effective February 1, 2008, an increase in FFS membership dues will take effect.

Renewal fees will increase as shown below: New member fees (single or couple) will increase from \$30 to \$32. One year renewal (single or family) from \$20 to \$22. Multiple years paid at the same time (single or family) from \$15 to \$17.

For example:

Two year renewal (single or family) will be \$34 Three year renewal (single or family) will be \$51 Four year renewal (single or family) will be \$68 ...and so on

This increase, the first in more than ten years, is needed to permit the FFS to continue its financial support of the performing Freshmen and reflects increase in printing costs and postage for FreshNews. Members can renew before February 1, 2008 at the current rates of \$20 for a one-year renewal and \$15 per year for multi-year renewals paid at the same time.

BUDDY MORENO AND ADAM TRACY PLAY THE FOUR FRESHMEN IN ST. LOUIS

As we enter the world with hope for a better world, let me say a few things about two gentleman who have made my world a better and happier place in recent years through music.

Carlos "Buddy" Moreno is still working on a regular basis as a jazz radio broadcaster. Buddy and his radio partner, Adam Tracy, co-host a three hour Saturday show on WSIE 88.7 FM, a public radio station in the St.. Louis suburb of Edwardsville, Illinois. The station is on the campus of Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, where Adam Joined Buddy in 1994 as an assistant on "The Buddy Moreno Show" as an 18 year old freshman at the college. Adam came to the show as a student of classical piano. He now truly appreciates the music that Buddy has been involved in throughout his life.

Buddy suffered a stroke in June, 2005. Since then, Adam has been the primary "D.J." on the show. But Buddy has made a miraculous recovery and has co-hosted the show several times in recent months; most recently on December 1, 2007! Buddy has been in the music business since his teens. Over those 80 years he has, as written in George T. Simon's book "The Big Bands" at page 281, "projected a pleasant personality and a voice to match". Buddy has done this on recordings with orchestras led by Griff Williams, Harry James, Dick Jurgens, and his own band, the Buddy Moreno Orchestra.

Shortly after Adam began his duties as primary host of the show. He also began planning his wedding to Katie. Buddy was able to attend the wedding with his daughter and son-in-law in October, 2006 along with the writer and a large gathering of family and friends. A more recent highlight was Buddy's 95th birthday party in July, 2007 with about 100 close friends and a dinner dance with music by St. Louis favorites, Gary Dammer and his jazz group and vocalist Sherry Drake. Adam was M.C. of the party and excelled.


Buddy and Adam have impeccable taste in the musical selections of their show. After a "flag waver" big band opener with the likes of Woody Herman, Count Basie, or Gordon Goodwin they weave their way through the three hours with expected and unexpected musical delights among which are The Four Freshmen, Stan Kenton, Sue Raney, Marilyn Maye, the Hi-Los, Vic Damone, Steve Lawrence, Frank Sinatra, Peter Marshall, Kevin Stout, and Buddy Moreno himself!

At the Pittsburgh convention, Ross Barbour called in to Buddy and Adam's show on Dick Hatfield's cell phone to the delight of Buddy and Adam and their listeners. Ross remembers Buddy as a fine singer and band leader. Two of the more notable sideman in Buddy's band were Bill Trujillo, a 1950's Kenton tenor sax member and someone close to our own Curtis Calderon, a trumpet player featured on the band's theme song "Devil May Care", a fellow Texan, Don Jacoby. May Buddy and Adam continue to provide us with great music for years to come!



Anchoring the traditional Thursday night open jam session will be an outstanding quartet of musicians led by trumpeter mark Buselli. Buselli, former director of jazz studies at Butler University, currently holds a similar appointment to the faculty of Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana. He has presented educational programs for over 5,000 children in the Indianapolis area and has been commissioned as a composer by the American Pianists Association, the Indianapolis Brass Ensemble, and Western Michigan University. He has numerous recordings as a sideman and co-leader of the Buselli/Wallarab Jazz Orchestra in Indianapolis. Mark has performed as a soloist on the Hal Leonard Jazz Band Series and has worked with the Artie Shaw Band, the Benny Goodman Tribute Band, Natalie Cole, Jerry Lewis, Vic Damone, Ben Vereen, Herb Pomeroy, Slide Hampton, Slam Stewart, Sandi Patti, and many other jazz notables. He graduated from the Berklee College of Music with a degree in performance and arranging and from Indiana University with a master of music degree in jazz studies.



Composed of outstanding professional instrumentalists from central Indiana, The IJO was created to represent and to preserve the dynamic history of the big band, patterned after the great musical groups like Glenn Miller, Stan Kenton, Tommy Dorsey, Count Basie, Duke Ellington, among others. Under the musical direction of lead trumpeter, Jeff Anderson, and as an ongoing project of the Jazz Arts Society of Indiana, the band's members have performed all across the country and the world with touring acts, on cruise ships, at theme parks, with military bands and collegiate groups. Most have played in back-up bands and orchestras for nationally known entertainers and for world famous jazz artists. Collectively, they can account for nearly two dozen degrees in music and continue to be heavily involved in the field of music education.

Leader Jeff Anderson holds degrees from Morehead State, Eastern Illinois, and Ball State Universities. Along with being named "Best Lead Trumpet Player" at the Elmhurst (Chicago), Kansas City, Ohio State (Columbus), and Aquinas (Grand Rapids) jazz festivals, Jeff has been a professional musician for more than 25 years. He regularly performs in Indianapolis, Cincinnati, and Louisville and has directed instrumental ensembles and taught privately at Ball State and Eastern Illinois Universities. For the past 17 years, he has taught jazz studies and directed a variety of instrumental ensembles at Taylor University. He has lead the IJO in a number of musical tribute concerts featuring the music of Frank Sinatra and Glenn Miller. In memory of the important musical relationship between The Four Freshmen and the great Stan Kenton bands, expect to enjoy a number of arrangements performed by the IJO in the Kenton style. Following the band's set, they'll join the Freshmen for a few arrangements to open the evening's performance by the fabulous Four Freshmen. Indeed, this promises to be a most memorable event.






SATURDAY NIGHT DINNER JAZZ



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


During "Fresh Talk" at the Pittsburgh convention, an Ohio FFS member praised Sue, saying "She is one of the most underrated female singers of all time in America. There is no one who pronounces or enunciates words or caresses the words or makes you feel the words of the song like Sue Raney". He then asked her to highlight some of her musical influences.

She said "That's very sweet. Oh my gosh! You know, when I was growing up I lived in Albuquerque, New Mexico so I sang a lot of country songs when I first started and I didn't really get into jazz or listen to a lot of jazz: singers like June Christy or Anita O'Day or Chris Connor. I really liked Doris Day, Patti Page, and Rose-mary Clooney: I mean they were the people that I would buy their records and I was just influenced by them.

I loved Perry Como. I loved him so much: you know he was great. I really always wanted to meet him someday, I thought I would before he passed away. I loved him! Nat Cole, I loved Nat Cole. So I wasn't into listening to a lot of jazz at that time in my life. Then when I started recording for Capitol, my A&R man had me start to listen to Ella and Sarah Vaughan and Carmen McRae. Then I kind of ventured into that area. They were influential. I really tried to learn to swing and I'd put Ella on and sing with her. And that's how I felt her time and feel and that helped me a lot as far as learning how to swing."

Dear Bob,

Thanks for the Don Fagerquist tape. . .I love his playing. . .back in 1946 or '47 when "Red Rodney" was leaving the Gene Krupa band, I went to NYC to audition for the "jazz" chair. While I read all the music quite expertly. . .my jazz playing wasn't exactly what they were looking for. So, who got the job? Don Fagerquist. . . .Oh, Well. . .
