The Four Freshmen receive the "SATCHMO" Award

The Four Freshmen will receive one of the most prestigious awards in jazz, the Satchmo Award, at the 30th Annual Sarasota Jazz Festival March 1, 2010 in Sarasota, Florida. The award is named after the legendary trumpet player Louis Armstrong also know as Satchmo.

This award has been presented to many of the great jazz musicians including Dave Brubeck, George Shearing, Gerry Mulligan, Lionel Hampton and posthumously to Duke Ellington and Ella Fitzgerald.

Famed sculptor Frank Eliscu, who also designed the famous Heisman Trophy for outstanding college football players, was the designer for the Satchmo Award, which is presented each year for "Unique and Enduring Contributions to the Living History of Jazz..Our Original American Art Form".

An original Satchmo Award is struck each year for the winner and presented by the Jazz Club of Sarasota, the most active jazz club in the United States with over 80 concerts a year. The 30th Annual Sarasota Jazz Festival runs from Sunday, February 28 to Saturday, March 6 with performances each day. Other performers at the 2010 Festival include Dick Hyman, Peter Appleyard, Harry Allen, Doug Cameron, and Greg Nielsen. A new feature in 2010 will be Youth Jazz Night on March 6th with young jazz performers



from many parts of the country performing.

Two unique events are Jazz in the Park on February 28th with two big bands competing for the fans and the Jazz Trolley on March 3rd, which features trolleys taking fans back and forth from six different jazz venues all evening.

- 5) You can print a copy on your own printer if you want a paper copy; and, you can print only those pages that interest you.


If you're unaware of how to view FreshNews online, you can do so by going to www.fourfreshmen society.com/freshnews.

MusicMart is now accepting orders for the new CD and more information on that is available on the website.



The Jazz Cruise 2009 with THE FOUR FRESHMEN

November 8-15, 2009 by Jim Bell

On Sunday, November 8, a group of 1,900 jazz lovers embarked from Ft. Lauderdale on Holland America's Westerdam for a week of "straight-ahead" jazz in the Caribbean. Of course, the anchor with top billing was our guys, "The Four Freshmen".

They performed stand alone gigs on Monday at 1:00 p.m., Tuesday at 4:00 p.m., and Wednesday at 10:30 p.m. in various venues throughout the ship playing tunes from the Great American Songbook: "Route 66", "Day By Day", "Laura", "Rain", to name a few, plus, Bob got everyone's attention with "How Do You Keep the Music Playing". After the performance, the ship was buzzing about The Four Freshmen. For many, it was the first time they had heard the guys and for others, they were happy to have found them again. Tuesday's session was a flashback to "the Cave" in Bowling Green. The venue was way too cold. Vince was blowing into his hands to stay warm so he could sing and play the Bass.

Thursday they performed with the 18 piece Anita E. Berry's Big Band in the largest venue on the ship which seats 900 people. The Big Band was directed by Ken Peplowski who also played the Sax and Clarinet, Butch Miles on Drums, Warren Vache on Trumpet, John Fedchoch on Trombone & Arranger, Wycliffe Gordon on Trombone, Gerald Stafford on Trumpet, and my favorite James Chirrillo on Guitar, with Johnny Mandel, legendary composer and arranger, making sure no one goofed, plus many other world renowned musicians. The band was screaming. The Four Freshmen rocked the house opening with "Day In Day Out" followed by "Poinciana", "If! Had You", "Walking My Baby Back Home", "Fools Rush In", "Rain", Greg Stegeman's arrangement of "Live Trombones", "Mam'selle", "Angel Eyes", and "Somebody Loves Me". The crowd was jumping. The session closed out with one of Curtis's favorites "It's All Right with Me", among others. Brian was outstanding on lead vocal as well as directing the big band. The evening ended with a standing ovation. I am sure that they made many new fans and future society members.

Friday at 2:00 p.m, they did a casual fun gig. Into the set, Bob asked Jeff Hamilton to join them on the snares which he did. He jammed with Curtis on "Another You", "It's a Blue World", "After You've Gone", and "Graduation Day", and closed out five great sets with our guys at sea.

No matter when we see The Four Freshmen be it with a big band, a symphony orchestra, in a jazz club, at a world famous concert hall, or on a ship, they always give a fantastic performance. We look forward to the next time we are together in Annapolis or before.

Editors Note;

The following article was submitted to Fresh News in the summer of 2007 but was never printed. This report on the Freshmen performance with the Columbus OH JAZZ ORCHESTRA was written by former FFS President Ted Driscol. Ted's comments on this concert reflects his life long involvement with the music business and a similar affection for the music of The Four Freshmen. This is just too good to not include, even at this late date.

Recently, my old friend of almost 60 years, Nick Alexander, invited us to join him and Barbara at a "Road Show" performance by the Columbus OH Jazz Orchestra and The Four Freshmen. Every time I hear one of these concerts, it occurs to me that Stan Kenton could have been another Igor Stravinsky if he were born in the nineteenth-century complex tempos and harmonies, unusual intervals, and extraordinary creativity with his compositions. He sure knew how to put a team of musicians and arrangers(like Pete Rugolo)together, just as The Columbus Jazz Orchestra does. He also knew how to find great musicians in Dayton OH.

The orchestra led off with "Stompin' at the Savoy" smooth tenor saxes, with counterpoint provided by a well-balanced trombone section and a powerful trumpet accompaniment. Kelly Crum's vocal rendition of "Something Cool" was not reminiscent of June Christy. Her phrasing emphasis was quite a bit different. "How High the Moon" was done with precision among all of the sections but with a faster tempo than the original Kenton orchestra arrangement. "Bernie's Tune" produced a very interesting three-way communication among the bass player, the drummer, and the pianist.

Enter the Four Freshmen they started out with "If I Had You", then "Little Girl Blue." The single-microphone arrangement was perfect for delicate, soft songs such as those. The tone-colors of their voices are extremely compatible. Intonation, enunciation, attacks and cut-offs, and even the subtle "passing tones" were, to me, sung flawlessly. Brian, during both of these songs, accompanied on his Taylor thin-body, with acoustic-electric guitar. His technique produces a soft, appealing, pure acoustic sound with just the right volume and expression; consequently, you are essentially hearing a "fifth voice." If "Little Girl Blue" composers Rodgers and Hart would have been up in the balcony, they most likely would have said " yes, that is what we had in mind when we wrote that song."

The pace changed with "Day In, Day Out" once again, with dazzling accompaniment from the orchestra. "Poinciana" (my all-time favorite) was next, and performed beautifully. Curtis' cornet solo was a clinic on horn playing subtle and complex phrasing, wide variations of tone-color, and a broad range of expression. It is interesting that he plays a cornet instead of a trumpet. The cornet(possessing a conically shaped mouthpiece receiver), typically has a mellower quality than the trumpet(which has a cylindrically shaped mouthpiece receiver), designed for brilliance and projection. But, Curtis produces a cornet, trumpet, and even, at times, a flugelhorn quality of sound one horn, three different responses.

"Intermission Riff' displayed the talent of their outstanding pianist, and, a guest pianist somewhat different piano solos; but both exciting solos. The Columbus Jazz Orchestra captured the Stan Kenton orchestra masterpiece, "Peanut Vendor" absolutely magnificently.... driving rhythm section, fiery trombone solo section, and a trumpet section that sounded like five Maynard Fergusons and a couple of Mike Beisners trumpets played with precisely the same brilliance, tone-color, and intonation. At one point they all hit a double-hi "F" in perfect unison.

The Freshmen ended the evening with "Blue World", "There Will Never Be Another You", "In This Whole Wide World," and, "Route 66." The audience could hardly stop applauding. After the show, we spent a fun evening talking with the Freshmen their enthusiasm for their artistic work is very obvious.

Bob, Brian, Vince, and Curtis to me, their voices just keep getting better and better. The quality of the performance at this concert is a testimony of dedication and commitment toward extending the legacy of Four Freshmen excellence. And, it was especially enjoyable to hear the concert with Karen, Barbara, and Nick almost 60 years ago, Nick and I "discovered" the Four Freshmen at the very same time. And, a special thank you to Nick for his contributions to this article.

FOOTNOTE: I mentioned that Curtis Calderon was flawless I was wrong his knowledge of NBA basketball is seriously suspect. He bet me that The Detroit Pistons would beat The Cleveland Cavaliers in the playoffs this year. The Pistons lost. Recap: The Four Freshmen

The evening of Sunday, October 11th was a celebration as Jack and Mary Morrison brought the fabulous Four Freshmen to perform for an avid audience made up mostly of members of the West Mich. Jazz Society and the Four Freshmen Society. The four talented vocalist/instrumentalists have been the smooth reincarnation of the over 60-year old quartet for many years, selected separately but joined perfectly. Whether crooning a slow ballad favorite such as "Blue World" or swinging an up-tempo "Day By Day", you could close your eyes and drift back to your more youthful days of listening to the original recordings of the famous four that founded and paved the road for future foursomes, or you could open them and enjoy the sight and sounds of the present group performing live the timeless and awesome arrangements that will never lose their youthful vigor.

Special mention must be made of the horn player, Curtis Calderon. While not as tall as the others, he stood front and center every time he took a solo on either the trumpet or flugelhorn. His purity of tone was outstanding on both instruments; his phrasing impeccable; his choice of which to select to enhance the various arrangements always on target. These ears found no brass instrument as mellow and expressive as a well-played flugelhorn, but his trumpet was dynamic without ever being shrill. Holding down center stage was the bassplaying baritone, Vince Johnson, whose scatting along with his solos brought forth appreciative applause from many members of the audience who may have been, like me, remembering the great Slim Galliard's stylings in this manner. Brian Eichenberger is the youngest member of the group at age 33, but has held his position as only the third lead singer in the group's history for nearly a decade, after being selected 13 years ago as bass player and second voice. His boyish good looks don't detract from his ability to supply a firm foundation on the melody of each arrangement.

Last but not least (as the saying goes), is drummer Bob Ferreira who at age 39 has been a Four Freshmen the longest - 17 years. Given four young male entertainers to look at for two hours, any woman regardless of age is going to choose a favorite, and he was mine. Tall, handsome, bald, dynamic, great voice, fantastic drummer, sexy, what more could anyone want? I suspect Mary Morrison has, at some point in time over their many years of attending Four Freshmen events, made the same partiality somewhat obvious. Why else would he perform the only totally solo number of the evening, and dedicate it to her? Maybe I'm just jealous, but for whatever reason, it was a great addition to a great evening. Again, our sincere thanks to the Morrison's for making this event possible.

FF Show in Oklahoma City

At the Four Freshmen's concert at Oklahoma City Community College on December 1st, Curtis jokingly introduced "Route 66" under the pseudo-title of "Oklahoma City's Mighty Pretty." That, along with a hundred other things during the evening, evoked laughter and applause.

As always, the crowd truly enjoyed the evening with the Four Freshmen. It was a repeat performance at OCCC; they appeared on the same stage in December a year ago. The house was sold out (about 250 seats), but everybody who showed up got to see the show, including a couple of FFS members from Missouri who made the drive to Oklahoma City hoping they could get tickets at the door and were able to do so. I also had encountered the sold out problem in advance, but a good samaritan read about my plight on this site and solved that problem. At least three FFS members from Texas also made the trek to OKC, including FFS Texas rep Ann Smith.

Taking notes during a performance distracts from my purposes for being there, so this is being written from memory. Please forgive any gaffes.

The guys gave a solid and entertaining show with a lot of lively banter and those great FF sounds. I'd never heard "Easy Street" performed live, so I was glad that old smoothie was added to the evening's routine.

Of course they worked in several seasonal songs from their "Snowfall" CD, including, "I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus", "Christmastime is Here", Frosty the Snowman", "It's Beginning to Look a lot Like Christmas", and "Let it Snow."

I don't remember hearing this particular bit before, but on one of their "out front" numbers with Curtis on the horn, Vince on bass and Brian's guitar, they delivered a very smooth little jazz riff that almost came across as chamber music. Throughout the show, Curtis's brass work along with Vince's whistling and scatsounds, brought a lot of added pleasure for the crowd as did all the songs due to that fantastic Freshmen harmony. Of course all four guys were in great voice and each added bits of wisdom (or humor) during the evening.

They sang several longtime FF standards plus assorted numbers from "Live in Holland", "In Session", and the upcoming "Live Trombones" collection. Along with the other tunes already mentioned, I also remember hearing "Poinciana", "Mam'selle", "There Will Never Be Another You", "In This Whole Wide World", "Blue World", "Day by Day", "Day In, Day Out", and "Angel Eyes." I don't recall having heard Group 22 do "It Could Happen to You" before, so I was glad to hear it. They closed the evening with the lovely "And So It's Over."

I don't remember which song it was, but once when Curtis really got going with his horn, I thought for a moment I heard something similar to "Blue Moon" and half-expected Bob to join in with the lyrics. Guess maybe I was just having a senior moment.

Another bonus of the evening: There were two coeds in front of us that seemed to enjoy the show. Seated right behind us was another college-age girl with her grandmother. The girl knew the music and spoke knowledgeably about the Freshmen and said that she had some of their arrangements. Great to see such a devoted young fan.

Hopefully, we're going to see more and more young faces at FF concerts.



1959 Concert Review

On the surface, the appearance of The Four Freshmen at the 1959 Newport Jazz Festival might seem an odd booking. And yet, the vocal group from Indiana had done recordings with the Stan Kenton Orchestra and with arranger Pete Rugolo which received critical acclaim. The members of the group also played instruments while singing and, in at least a couple of cases, were solidly swinging jazz improvisors. But it was their ability to create lush, harmonically sophisticated cord voicings within appealing pop songs that gained them a wide following. Not as full of improvisational verve as Lambert, Hendricks & Ross to be sure, but ambitious nonetheless. The four gentlemen comprising The Four Freshmen - brothers Don and Ross Barbour, Bob Flanigan, and Ken Albers, charmed the Newport audience with their professionally run show, which included renditions of many jazz standards. Their 2nd set was marred, however, by the presence of a stubbornly out-of-tune guitar that Don Barbour struggled with throughout the course of the show. Nevertheless, the Newport crowd could be heard cheering for more at the end of their hour-long performance at Freebody Park in Newport, Rhode Island.



Following Newport program announcements from master of ceremonies Willis Connover, from Voice of America, and band introductions from The Four Freshmen spokesman, drummer Ross Barbour, they kicked it off with a snappy, upbeat rendition of George Gershwin's "Somebody Loves Me." While it is clear from the outset that Don Barbour's guitar was badly out of tune and being distorting through the sound system, they plowed ahead and Ken Albers delivered a jazz trumpet solo in the middle of that oft -covered chestnut, which is underscored by Ross' deft brushwork on the kit. "You're All I See" is a bit of a lush schmaltz with an appealing trombone solo by Bob Flanigan, while the exotic "Grenada" features a opening trumpet fanfare by Albers that set the proper tone for this flamenco flavored piece. I heard Guitarist Don Barbour trying to adjust his intonation in time for the fourth tune, the harmonically rich jazz ballad "Angel Eyes," to no avail. But in spite of his rough going, trombonist Flanigan delivered a beautiful trombone solo that salvaged the gorgeous piece.

They swung their way through "There Will Never Be Another You," with drummer Ross Barbour setting a brisk tone

with his brushwork and Flanigan offering another convincing trombone solo. The intonation problems on the guitar were eliminated on the next piece which was an acappella version of the wistful ballad "I'm Always Chasing Rainbows." Then drummer Ross stepped forward for his vocal feature of the set, offering a comical Donald Duck voiced take on the standard "Sweet Lorraine," which the crowd seems to respond to with good natured laughs. A mambo rendition of "Day by Day," a big hit for the group in 1955," features another potent trombone solo by Flanigan and The Four Freshmen close their set on a rousing note with "Mr. B's Blues," their first single cut in 1950 for Capitol which launched them on their way.






