



WELCOME TO LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY

The 29th annual FFS Convention will return to the Midwest August 25-27, 2016 and promises to be yet another great Society gathering! Centrally located, Louisville is easily reached by air or car, located within a day's drive of 2/3 of the U.S. population. Overlooking the Ohio River, the beautiful Galt House Hotel boasts 1.290 quest rooms, dozens of meeting rooms, and two spacious ballrooms. It is the largest downtown meeting, convention, and conference hotel in the region and is located conveniently in the heart of Louisville. The Galt House is an official Host Hotel of the Kentucky Derby, Louisville Bats Baseball, the Louisville Opera, and a partner hotel of the University of Louisville Athletics. The hotel includes six restaurants and lounges, a rooftop fitness center, outdoor pool, spa and salon, on-site parking garages, shops, and a beautiful conservatory connecting the two guestroom towers. All of the room block of deluxe guest rooms (\$115/night), Convention sessions, and concerts will be located in the Rivue Tower.

TOURS

Two optional tours are offered this year. We're sorry, but timing <u>does not</u> offer the opportunity to take both tours as the Churchill Downs morning tour will not return in time to board the Louisville Belle.

1. The first tour is <u>Churchill Downs</u>, home of the world famous Kentucky Derby. We board the motor coaches at 7:30 am for the Backstretch Breakfast Tour at Churchill Downs, which is a truly exclusive experience as this area of the race track is not open to the general public. Guests are able to experience a behind-the-scenes look into the world of thoroughbred racing by viewing early morning track work-outs. This once-in-a-lifetime tour includes a visit to the Track Kitchen where guests may encounter jockeys, trainers, owners and key personnel involved in the world of horseracing. During breakfast, a retired jockey will mix and mingle with guests while sharing information and answering questions. This adds a true element of authenticity to the backstretch experience with up-close and personal information from an intimate point of view. The jockey appearance provides a first-hand perspective of thoroughbred racing that few ever experience. After visiting the Track Kitchen, guests are escorted to view the horses rail-side where they will not only see but also hear the horses as they thunder down the track.

We will then board the coaches for a quick trip to the frontstretch and the Kentucky Derby Museum. There is only one place that transforms a yearly event into a daily celebration. One place where facts, whimsy, strategy, luck, fashion, and passion align as one to showcase the most exciting 2 minutes in sports. Welcome to the Kentucky Derby Museum! The 360 degree film, "The Greatest Race" puts guests in the heart of the Kentucky Derby action. To further enhance the experience, guests are treated to an exclusive look of the world's most prestigious and historic racetrack with a guided walking tour. The Museum's onsite equine residents stand ready in their private stables located in the Museum's garden to welcome guests to the Bluegrass State. Cost for the Churchill Downs tour is \$58.

2. The second tour is a luncheon cruise on the Ohio River aboard the 102 year-old paddlewheel steamboat, the <u>Belle of Louisville</u>. Experience a cruise that is like a step back in time. Steam powered and paddlewheel propelled, the Belle is the only remaining authentic steamboat from the great American packet boat era. The Belle is a National Historic Landmark and holds the distinction of the most widely traveled steamboat in American history. Have lunch in the windowed ballroom, visit the original engine room to see engines dating back to the 1890's, and enjoy sightseeing on the open air deck. The Belle is a short walk from the Galt House and requires 30 or 40 steps down from hotel to the dock level. Handicap accessibility is available, but somewhat limited. Once on the Belle, there is a staircase to the dining level. A "lift" is available, but it is a one person lift. We will board the Belle at 11:30 am for a 12 noon departure, and the boat will return at 2:00 pm. Cost for the Belle Cruise is \$35.

HATITUDE

KENTUCKY DERBY DAY will continue from 2:00 - 4:00 pm with HATITUDE at the Galt House! Hats are not only a horseracing tradition but are also the signature fashion statement of the Kentucky Derby. During Hatitude, both men and women design their own one-of-a-kind creations. All hats, ribbons, feathers and fanfare are provided during this fun-filled activity. Guests have the opportunity to showcase their personal style, whether it's simple and chic or flashy and flamboyant. Fashion + attitude = Hatitude! Please wear your hats for the DERBY NIGHT DINNER that evening. Cost for this activity is \$25.

If whiskey is your thing, you are in the right place. Louisville is known for its "Whiskey Row" along Main Street. You may want to visit the Evan Williams Bourbon Experience to learn about the early days of Louisville's bourbon-steeped history and see a distillery in action or visit one of several other distilleries in downtown Louisville. We hope you come early for the Convention and stay late! There is much to see and do in the beautiful city of Louisville.

<u>REGISTRATION</u>: Registration begins on February 1, 2016. You may register by mail and pay by check or credit card using the Registration Form in this newsletter or online at <u>www.ffs.2016</u> Please provide all requested information, including first <u>and</u> last names.

<u>TABLE ASSIGNMENTS</u>: Dinner seating will be at tables of eight (8). Location will be made based on the postmark date or online registration date on or after 2-1-16 of the <u>last</u> member in your party. We encourage you to send them all at the same time. To ensure that you will receive assigned seating with others you want at your table, please provide all names.

<u>HOTEL INFORMATION</u>: We recommend you make your hotel reservation early. Rooms at the Galt House Hotel will be reserved on a first-come, first served basis. Rates for the convention are guaranteed at \$115 plus tax per night in the Revue Tower for a deluxe guestroom with two queen beds or one king bed. Executive suites in the Suite Tower are available for \$135 plus tax per night. (One-bedroom waterfront balcony suites in the Revue Tower are available at \$195 plus tax per night). These rates will also be available for three days before and three days after the official convention dates of August 25 - 27, as long as rooms are available. PLEASE NOTE: It is not possible to take both tours as coaches from Churchill Downs do not return in time to board the Belle.

HATITUDE: Hatitude is a new session at this year's convention on Friday from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. in the Galt House. In recognition of the 142nd year of the Kentucky Derby, convention ladies and gentlemen are invited to Hatitude. Hats and decorations will be provided along with assistance for you to design your own Derby Hat to wear to the Friday evening dinner which will be Derby Night! Cost for Hatitude is \$25.

PERFECT HARMONY: Music career took vocalist around the world

There is always perfect harmony in the home of Autie Goodman, retired and living in Pahrump with his wife and son.

Goodman was a musician and vocalist with The Four Freshmen, the original group dating back to 1948 and known for performing jazz, and classic pop in the style of a barbershop quartet.

Goodman's son, known in the music industry as Terry Nails, moved from Florida to live with his parents, bringing together two talented musicians from different musical eras under the same roof.

Goodman used to live in Las Vegas for almost 40 years before coming to Pahrump in 1999 after he retired from The Four Freshmen.

"We love it out here, it's so quiet and nice," Goodman said.

Born and raised in Burns, Oregon, Goodman was about 12 years old when he heard world-renowned Artie Shaw play the clarinet. He told his dad that's what he wanted to do.

He got his first clarinet in the mail, took some lessons and his interest in music just continued from there.

Goodman started playing a tenor sax in his teens so he could join a group in Burns.

Another one of his idols and friends was the late Buddy DeFranco, Goodman calling him the "greatest jazz clarinet player that ever lived."

He moved to Portland, Oregon after serving time in the military, got married and lived in Phoenix for a short time before relocating to Las Vegas where his professional musical career took off.

"Music's the only thing I've ever done good," Goodman said.

His son, Terry Nails, with a background as a rock musician has performed and recorded music with a sound far different from The Four Freshmen.

"He's a good guy, he's done a lot of stuff too, different than what we did, but he still has the talent that he got from his mother and I," Goodman said.

Goodman said that his son has a lot of jazz in him and is a good bass player.

In the 1960's, Goodman was with a group called The Modernaires and later joined a band working at the former Hacienda Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas before being invited by Bob Flanigan, the

last original member of The Four Freshman, to join their group in 1977. Goodman performed with them for fifteen years.

After moving to Pahrump, Goodman entertained for about three years at the now closed Tommasino's restaurant with owner/musician Tom Saitta and well-known Vegas pianist Tommy Deering.

"Tommy Deering told me one thing," Goodman said. "You didn't become a musician, you were born a musician'."

Goodman, a multi-talented musician, sang solos, played the drums and the saxophone while with The Four Freshmen. The other group members also sang and played instruments including keyboard, trombone, bass and guitar.

"We were very busy, I'll tell you, we were self-contained," said Goodman, as he pointed to a photo of the group playing at the Dunes in Vegas. "If we went somewhere and they didn't have a band, we didn't care, we just set up, did our own thing anyway."

Goodman's career with The Four Freshmen took him all around the world, including stops in about 20 different countries and every state in the union.

He got to meet many musical icons such as Sammy Davis Jr., Vic Damon and Nat King Cole, whom Goodman described as "the greatest singer that ever lived," calling him his "idol".

Goodman also worked in popular jazz singer Billy Eckstine's big band for a time.

Perry, his wife of 63 years, is still very smitten with Auti and, of course, a longtime loyal fan.

She said no one can play the alto sax as good as him and he is the greatest vocalist.

"He phrases when he sings, he doesn't blah, blah, blah, you know, the lyrics," she said. "He gives you the whole thing as if he's written a poem or a love song." She refers to him as the "greatest love song singer" who still gives her the chills and has a beautiful voice.

They met in Oregon in a club where Autie was singing.

"And what a voice he had and beautiful blue eyes, adorable," Perry Goodman said.

Autie Goodman said that Perry is musically inclined even though she has never performed.

"We sing and laugh a lot," Perry Goodman said.

"Terry and I both have that disease, if somebody says a phrase that's in a song, we immediately sing it,"

she said.

"We've always got some musical thing going," Autie Goodman said.

His favorite song was one written

by Ken Albers, "It Could Happen to You." It was the greatest arrangement that Goodman said he ever sang.

Other hits performed by The Four Freshmen over their six-decade history include *Graduation Day, It's a Blue World* and *Day by Day* and the list just goes on.

Over the years the names and faces of the group have changed multiple times from when two brothers, Ross and Don Barbour, both deceased, started a barbershop-type quartet with a different name while college freshmen in Indianapolis.

Ross Barbour, the last of the original Four Freshmen was 82 when he died in 2011. Referring to a 1986 photo cover of The Four Freshmen on the Las Vegas magazine *What's On*, Goodman remarked that it was the best, most talented group they had.

He and Flanigan left the group in 1993 when Flanigan retired since Goodman didn't want to work without him. Flanigan, who managed the group and owned the name rights, died in 2011 at the age of 84.

A new group of performers still tour under the The Four Freshmen name.
