





This year's Convention promises to be another great event under the leadership of Marlene Lobsiger and Dave Blackwell, both of by Neil Lantz





The Hilton Hotel has graciously extended their low room rates three days before and three days after the convention date. A free shuttle is available from the airport to the hotel. You may call the Hilton Hotel 260/422-4002 and advise them of the arrival time of your flight. This will give you a shorter wait time for the shuttle.

Parking in the city parking garage is free; however the Hilton confirmation system will always show a parking fee on your bill. When you check in be sure to ask the desk clerk to remove the fee.

Dan de la Torre has designed a great logo for the 75th Anniversary Commemorative shirt. The shirt is a collared shirt in black and available in both ladies' and men's sizes.

"Fresh Memories" was a winner last year and once again we will meet to share and enjoy memories of the past. Current and former Four Freshmen and others, along with members from the Ross Barbour family will share their memories from 1948 to the present.

Members from our Fort Wayne committee will be on tap to greet you in the 113 Club. The Wannabees will meet both Thursday and Friday afternoon. We will be singing those great tunes that have been sung and performed by the Four Freshmen for the past 75 years. Thursday evening, opening night of the convention is the traditional Jam Session anchored by Dave Blackwell and The Jim Steele Trio where Fresh Fans and Four Freshmen alumni can sit in with their instruments or voices. The Jam Session is a great evening of fun and always brings some surprises. We encourage all musicians to sign up and be a part of this great, but casual opening night.

Friday morning both tours will leave the hotel at 9:30. A box lunch will be included with each tour.

Friday will be a very special night of celebration, taking us back to memories and memorabilia of the 113 Club, Fort Wayne, Indiana. The theme "Celebrating 75 Years" will open with dinner music by Jim Steele, local outstanding jazz pianist. The fabulous Four Freshmen will close out the evening's celebration followed by an "Afterglow" where you can meet and greet The Four Freshmen in the Hilton Hotel lobby.

Saturday morning there will be a Four Freshmen Society General Meeting. All members are encouraged to attend this very important meeting. Please check the schedule for the time.

Saturday night we will enjoy dinner music by Jim Steele jazz pianist. Following dinner we will have the pleasure of hearing another great concert by The Four Freshmen.

Fort Wayne known as "the city of churches" has much to offer its visitors. Some of the highlights of our beautiful downtown are great restaurants, unique boutique shops, the Allen County Library with the second largest genealogy center in the U.S., the beautiful Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, TinCaps Minor League baseball field, Embassy Theatre, Botanical Gardens, Fort Wayne Art Museum, the Allen County Courthouse with its magnificent mural paintings, Freimann Square and its beautiful flowers and fountains. One of the highlights of your visit that you will not want to miss is a visit to Fort Wayne's newest and most beautiful Promenade Park, located along the river with swings for adults, a covered pavilion, kayaking, walking trails, outstanding play areas for children with many other interesting things to do. Fort Wayne is also home to one of the top ten best Children's Zoo in the US. If you like to shop, it is only a 15 minute ride to the state-of-the-art Jefferson Pointe outdoor shopping mall including many places to dine. A 28 minute drive from the hotel will take you to Auburn, Indiana where you can visit the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum, a National Historic Landmark Exhibit of 120 cars on 3 floors. The famous Auburn Cord Duesenberg Festival and Car Auction over Labor Day weekend brings thousands from all over the world into the area every year.

Coney Island

Opening on Main Street in 1914 Coney Island is the oldest Coney Stand in America and Fort Wayne. Stepping into Coney Island is like stepping back in time. From the outside you can feast your eyes on the neatly lined rows of hot dogs cooking on the grill in the front window. The restaurant sells an average of 2,000 hot dogs a day and chops 70# onions per day. Coney Island is a local tradition and a must-see for visitors. Visiting and feasting on a hot dog at Coney Island is a must, and don't forget to grab a Coke in a classic bottle! Oh, by the way, try their famous chili, hamburgers and pie.





Sweetwater TOUR IS LIMITED TO 30. REGISTER EARLY. Sweetwater is the nation's largest retailer in the US for musical

instruments, pro audio gear and a campus that includes both in-house and online sales. The campus includes an Academy of Music and Technology, private lessons, three state-of-the-art recording studios, arcade games, a performance theatre, an outdoor performance pavilion for shows and an in-house diner and café.

Sweetwater employs over 2600 people offering their employees many perks on-site such as a Health Club with personal trainer, a salon and spa, medical clinic, DVD lending library, concierge service and more.

The tour begins at 10AM and ends at 11:00AM. A boxed lunch in their Downbeat Diner is included following the tour. The tour bus departs at 12:15 PM for the Hilton Hotel.

Veterans National at 12: Memorial Shrine and Museum

Founded by Eric and Cleo Scott in the early 1950s, this 40 acre Memorial Park welcomes all past and present Veterans. Eric Scott enlisted in the Army at the age of 19 and served in World War I. He spent six weeks in training and was assigned to the Third Infantry Division, Sixth Combat Engineers in France.

During the Battle of Marne in 1918, under heavy fire from his foxhole, Eric promised God if he survived the intense fighting he would establish a memorial to honor all of his fellow fighting soldiers and their families when he returned home. Eventually he began building a 2,400 square foot Shrine, museum and reception hall at 2122 O'Day Road. Their first reception was held in 1952 to honor many of his buddies who he served with.

The Vietnam Memorial Wall is one of the featured attractions at the Veterans Memorial Shrine and Museum. The permanent wall was dedicated in May 2021. This 80% replica stands 8 ft high at its center point and runs a full 360 feet from end to end. All 58,320 names of those men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice will forever be remembered on the wall here in Fort Wayne. At the east end of the wall is a Vietnam War monument erected to honor the local Vietnam community and all those that served during the 20 year war. A red legacy brick walkway leads to the monument lined with soldiers names and the dates they served.





FN JANUARY, FEBRUARY, MARCH 2023

A new 6,000 square foot W. Paul Wolf, War History Museum was recently built. The museum features military artifacts from all conflicts, displays and exhibits, a gift shop and a Paul's Coffee Café, where Veterans can gather and talk about their experiences.

Another highlight of the Veterans Shrine and Museum is the 40/8 Merci Box Car presented to the State of Indiana in 1949. This Box Car was a gift from the French people for supporting their efforts to defeat Nazi German during World War II. The French presented every state in the union with a commemorative Box Car filled with gifts from the French people.

Greencastle, and Hal Kratzsch from Warsaw. The group, all of whom were music students at the Arthur Jordan Conservatory of Butler University in Indianapolis, was originally a barbershop singing quartet named Hal's Harmonizers. They were later renamed the Top Hatters when they began to experiment with more modern harmonies. Significantly, in September of 1948, the quartet hired a Chicago talent agent, Dick Sheldon, who changed their name to the Freshmen Four and contracted their first professional gig at the 113 Club in Fort Wayne. Coincidentally, the Grand Wayne Convention Center and the connecting downtown Hilton Hotel, location of both the 2013 and this year's Convention, is nearly at the same location of the old 113 Club where Group #1 was booked for a week beginning on September 20, 1948. Following that week, the group continued with several other Midwest gigs until a January booking in Green Bay, Wisconsin, after which their name was changed to the Four Freshmen!

Seventy-five years later, it's also appropriate for us to celebrate the uninterrupted record of that great Freshmen sound as it has been continued for our fan pleasure by two dozen additional dedicated musicians including the great guys of Group #27 this year in Fort Wayne: Bob Ferreira, Tommy Boynton, Jake Baldwin, and Ryan Howe.

Without question, the track record of the 33 previous Conventions of the Society promises to be another great event for #34, and we hope to see all of you "Back Home Again In Indiana."

The Four Freshmen: Crooners Club

The night's performance showed again it's still the tight harmony, uptempo or otherwise, which so identified The Four Freshmen in their first 74 years, while highlighting some super instrumental performances.

Jake Baldwin, featured in several songs, continues a tradition of outstanding Freshmen horn work. New member, Ryan Howe, showed he can carry forth the important lead voice in the Freshmen delivery.

For Jake and Tom Boynton the Twin Cities area is their home base now. Jake is a well-recognized horn player in the area.

Coming down the show's closing stretch, the group ended with *The Day Isn't Long Enough* and *Route 66*, two stable tunes that brought standing applause, with *In This Whole Wide World* being the group's encore.



I got my picture, and here it is: Ken, Bill, Bob and Ross - satisfied after their fabulously good show. My first picture... my one and only!
