Some of you who have come to our recent concerts have heard us do a few things from the upcoming CD. We continue to draw from the Great American Songbook and have picked some of the old standards from WAY back in the day like *I Can't Believe That You're In Love With Me*. This is a great tune done by many traditional jazz bands. It was written in 1926 by Jimmy McHugh (music) and Clarence Gaskill (lyrics). Goes to show you that the Four Freshmen still have plenty of great songs to choose from. This is a fun one we enjoy playing and sometimes like to joke around about how it's a tune about a guy with low self-esteem.

We also have a more modern tune (relatively speaking) from the Great American Songbook entitled *Only Trust Your Heart*, you may have heard as well. This tune was written in 1964 by Benny Carter and Sammy Cahn. It's a nice tune that's been recorded a

few times, but is still relatively obscure when it comes to the "jazz standards." It's a nice change of pace from the straight ahead swing or beautiful ballads we sing.

One of the many gifts the Four Freshmen have been given are the talents of arranger Brian Eichenberger. All the vocal arrangements are done by Brian. He somehow captures the "sound" of the Four Freshmen, along with giving a modern flair to the Freshmen without having to abandon the sound we all love that can only be known as the FOUR FRESHMEN!!! For all of you Bob Ferreira fans out there, there are no tunes that feature just one person, but you still get to hear his warm, resonant voice on smaller solos on the CD! He only seems to get better and better throughout the years. Can you believe he's going on 20 years with the group this year?! Also, if you like some chilled out trumpet mixed with some bop licks, you'll get some of that from Curtis as well!

We don't want to ruin any surprise of tunes, so I won't give you what else is on the CD, but I will tell you you won't be disappointed! We have live strings as well. They are lush and played so well for this session. There's something special about a live string section that is amazing. Many people still use "fake" strings on their CDs but we felt we wanted to have real people playing real instruments. We also wanted to extend a little on the *Voices in Love* album. The orchestrator for this CD is Patrick Murray. He lives in Burbank, CA and writes

for different TV shows and has been doing big band and symphonic arrangements for us for many years now. You're going to love the strings on this thing!

This CD would not have been possible without your support! Our fabulous Four Freshmen Society has been instrumental in giving us the resources to make CDs the way WE want to make them. This is important because we want to make those before us proud. ## Four Freshmen Bring Talents to Three Stages



The latest incarnation of the vocal group "The Four Freshmen" will appear at Three Stages Performing Arts Center on Sunday. The original group was formed more than 60 years ago. The current four have been performing together for more than 10 years.

Though the adjective, "freshman" implies that someone is a novice at his or her art, the Four Freshmen, who will appear for one performance only at Three Stages Performing Arts Center on Sunday, Feb. 12, are anything but amateurs. The Four Freshmen group was formed more than 60 years ago as a barbershop quartet. Through experimentation with jazz harmonies, the group has influenced

the music world, including groups like the Beach Boys in the 1960s.

Today's incarnation of the longtime group include Bob Ferreira, Brian Eichenberger, Curtis Calderon and Vince Johnson — talented musicians who have been performing together for more than ten years.





"We are the second longest tenured group in the Four Freshmen's history," said Bob Ferreira. "We really blend musically." Craig Burnett, president of Folsom Lake Community Concert Association, is thrilled to bring the renowned group to Folsom.

"They were a last-minute add to our season — Three Stages actually held the program printing for us until we were able to secure the group. They are just great, and we're really excited about them coming here," Burnett said. "We have sold over 800 tickets."

Many Four Freshmen enthusiasts are excited, also. "I've had so many people call, saying they are huge fans, and asking for tickets," Burnett said. It's easy to see why the group has developed a following that crosses generations. Burnett describes the men as "gentlemen". "They're well dressed, well spoken, and hold the tradition of the original Four Freshmen," he said. But it's the music that keeps fans coming back. From the stirring harmony of the Beach Boys' iconic *Surfer Girl*, each member adding crystalline notes, to the jazzy, up-tempo *There Will Never be Another You*, a blast back to the 1940s, no group has better tonal quality, matched by a charm and charisma that can thrill an audience.

While Burnett said average fans are in their 50s, there's something in the group's repertoire for all ages.

"We use the Great American Songbook — classic, standard songs that everyone will know," Ferreira said. "The audience will love the music — they are wonderful arrangements. Half of our songs are older classics, and about half are songs that have been arranged by the current members of the group. We cover a lot of tunes in our hour and a half show."

While the harmonies are exquisite, the group is comprised of masterful musicians, as well.

"It's hard to classify ourselves. We are a four-part harmony, but we also have a jazz-based sound," Ferreira said. "The harmony is intricate, complex, and we back ourselves up instrumentally."

However you classify them, the group is renowned for their enthusiasm and passion for a good time.

"We have a lot of energy. We have a lot of fun. We love what we do, and that really shows," Ferreira said. "We're really excited to come up to Folsom and we hope the audience will enjoy us as much as we enjoy them."

# Piano News from Japan

"Yamaha and Kawai have recalled 20,000 pianos due to a problem with the pedal sticking, causing pianists to play faster than they normally would, resulting in a dangerous number of accidentals. The sticky pedal also makes it harder for pianists to come to a full stop at the end of a piece, making it extremely risky for audiences.

Although there have been a tremendous number of accidentals, fortunately it has so far caused no deafs.

Analysts are wondering if it will put a damper on their bass market and if they will be able to sustain sales.

Congress is also considering calling in the presidents of Yamaha and Kawai for questioning as to when the companies first learned about the treble."

## Talk about ending on a high note.

Your favorite quartet played to a sellout house at the Hopkins (Minn) Center for the Arts in concluding its 2012 season-bringing a sampling of holiday season songs mixed in with the old favorites and some from a pending new album. The Holiday Concert was an early Christmas present to an enthusiastic audience. Did the crowd enjoy it? Two standing ovations at the concert's ending *Day In, Day Out* answers the question. Ironically, the group opened with that number to kick off the new facility in suburban Minneapolis a few years back. It was the group's third straight sellout of 700-plus hand clapping folks at the venue, who had solid support of the local Twin Cities jazz society and the FFS.

The Freshmen talked about their recent road travels, but were refreshed for Hopkins after a short rest and already thinking about 2012. In the preceding two weeks they played dates in Wisconsin, to Florida, to New York before coming to town.

Blending in the seasonal Snowfall album songs, like *I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus* with *Plenty of Money and You, A Nightingale Sang in Barkley Square*, and *Stardust*, all candidates for the new album, the holiday concert was a great mixture for an enjoyable evening. A dozen or more FFS members were on hand, including lead singer Brian Eichenberger's parents and friends, most of whom live in the area.

For those FFS members at the 2011 convention in Toledo, they heard again what tight harmony can do with an evergreen like Hoagy Carmichael's often-recorded *Stardust*. As Curtis Calderon told the audience, the "new LP will have positive love songs"-- out with the sad in with the glad.

Many of the quartet's arrangements continue to favor Curtis' impressive trumpet and flugelhorn solos and the Hopkins date was no different, especially evident in *Angel Eyes* and *Somebody Loves Me*.

The favorite songs of decades ago still elicit the most applause, but the group's homage to the Beach Boys' *Surfer Girl* drew plenty of smiles and cheers as well. It was a total instrumental effort on *Route 66* with Brian very much in a Flanigan-esque power lead voice.

FFS folks know this particular group has been together for 10 years-- and overall they average 14 years of singing Freshmen music – and it shows. Hard to believe the group's tight harmony "sound" is in its seventh decade, each group including some strengths of their predecessors.

Following the concert, Christmas gift buyers crowded the CD sales tables where the Freshmen and Minnesota reps, Ann and Roger Johnson, and former rep, Dave Colwell, were busy taking orders, and a signing up a handful of new FFS members. The place was alive; bring on 2012.

## Sue Raney with the UofA Jazz and String Orchestras

The finale of the 34th Annual AzJazz Week was an absolutely amazing display of talent by the University of Arizona Studio Jazz Ensemble, and the Arizona Symphony Orchestra, both enhanced by the fabulous voice and presence of Miss Sue Raney. The audience at Crowder Hall on the UofA campus was also treated to the fine flugelhorn of Sue's husband, Carmen Fanzone. Many of the selections for the evening came from the donated archives at the UofA School of Music including those from Nelson Riddle and Lew Spence.

The song list provided an excellent palate for Sue's range and emotion, with tunes like *You're Driving Me Crazy, I Love Being Here With You, Listen Here, That Face, When Your Lover Has Gone, I'll See You In My Dreams, With A Song In My Heart*", and more. Of particular note was a beautiful song, *Statue of Snow,* written by Sue herself at an early age in collaboration with noted composer/ conductor, Ralph Carmichael. It isn't one that she performs regularly.

Opening the second half of the show was a small group taken from the Jazz Ensemble, with Carmen leading the way on *Just Friends*. It was terrific. We were pleased to hear him featured on three other tunes as well. The guy can play.

After the performance, a small reception was held for patrons to meet and greet the stars of the evening. It is so pleasant to see a couple relate so well to fans they have never met, and may never see again. Sue and Carmen are the real thing, and you should never miss an opportunity to see and hear their talent. Hope the organizers for Reno are able to invite them to the Convention this Fall!!

Voice and instruments combined on the Dvorak Concert Hall stage during "Stagestruck" on Sunday.

The Eastern Symphony Orchestra joined with Four Voices and a jazz quintet to present music composed by Americans. Four Voices includes members Allan Horney, a retired Eastern trombone professor; Thomas Birkner, the director of instrumental music at Belleville West High School; Craig Lindvahl, an Educator and documentary filmmaker from Effingham; and Joe Wolfe, a teacher and arranger. Paul Johnston, director of the Jazz Lab Band and coordinator of the combo program, also accompanied the orchestra and Four Voices on the jazz piano.

The orchestra performed *Overture to Candide* by Leonard Bernstein, *The Blue Bells of Scotland*, by Arthur Pryor, and *An American in Paris* by George Gershswin before Four Voices joined them on stage.

Mark Rheaume, a trombone player and the Concerto winner and a member of the Symphony Orchestra, performed a guest solo during *The Blue Bells of Scotland*.

Rheaume said he enjoyed his performance.

"I was pretty nervous before hand, but now I feel like a huge weight has been lifted, I feel great," Rheaume said. Rheaume said he enjoyed playing during the performance.

"It's cool to play with a quality ensemble, it is just a wonderful experience in college," Rheaume said.

The orchestra also accompanied Four Voices during *Girl Talk* by Bobby Troup, arranged by Neal Hefti and orchestrated by Wolfe, and *Walkin' My Baby Back Home* by Roy Turk, arranged by Greg Stegeman and orchestrated by Johnston. Horney said they enjoyed the performance.

"It was a great opportunity for us to sing with the orchestra and I think it went well," Horney said.

Katie Krabel, a cello player with the Symphonic Honors Initiative Program who played with the orchestra, said she liked playing with the different groups.

"It was a really good experience," Krabel said. "I've never accompanied vocals before, it was a really good experience."

The SHIP program is an outreach program that allows middle and high school string players to perform with the Eastern Symphony Orchestra. Krabel said she has enjoyed the experience.


"It's a lot more challenging so it motivates me to work hard to learn the music," Krabel said.

Wolfe said he enjoyed singing with the orchestra.


"It's a real great experience when you hear the combo, and then the orchestra, it's great to sing to that," Wolfe said. "To me, it enhances the music that much more."
