

<u>REGISTRATION INFORMATION:</u> Registration begins February 1, 2014. You may register online at www.ffs.2014.com or register by mail and pay by check or credit card using the form on the following page. Please provide all requested information, including first and last names (for name badges too).

<u>TABLE ASSIGNMENTS:</u> Dinner seating will be at tables of ten. To ensure that you will receive assigned seating with others you want at your table, please provide all names. Encourage your preferred tablemates to mail in their registrations early and on the <u>same day as seating will be arranged by postmark date or online registration date.</u>

<u>HOTEL INFORMATION</u>: We recommend you make your hotel reservations early. Rooms at the Doubletree Tampa Airport Westshore will be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis. Rates for the convention are guaranteed at \$109 plus tax per night for 2 queen beds or a king size. These rates will also be available for 3 days before and 3 days after the official convention dates of October 2, 3, and 4, 2014.

**TO RESERVE YOUR ROOM:** Call Doubletree Reservations at 800-222-8733. Be sure to use the group code FFS (Four Freshmen Society).

<u>COMMEMORATIVE SHIRTS</u>: The shirts are collared, polo style, with our new 2014 convention logo. They are silk-touch, 65% polyester, 35% cotton. First time ever, we are offering 4 different colors, representative of the beautiful state of Florida. They are Maui Blue (aqua), Hibiscus (coral), Light Pink, and Lime. There will only be a few shirts available at the convention. You are encouraged to order with your registration.

**JAM SESSION:** Thursday night's open jam session promises to be a great evening of jazz. While a talented local jazz quartet will anchor the evening's festivities, past and current Freshmen and convention attendees are welcomed and encouraged to participate. Please indicate your song, key, and instrument on the registration form so our quartet will be prepared to back up your song.

**TOURS:** Tour #1 embarks at 9:30 a.m. on Friday for a narrative city tour, admission and docent tours of the Henry Plant Museum and Ybor City State Museum. Lunch will be on your own while in Ybor City. Buses will return to the hotel at 1:30 p.m. Maximum number of guests: 100. Tour #2 embarks at 10:15 a.m. on Friday for a narrative city tour of Tampa's Bayshore Boulevard, the University of Tampa, and Ybor City by motor coach. At 11:30, we'll go aboard the Yacht Starship for a 3 course lunch and narrated tour of the Harbor. Buses return to the hotel at 2:15 p.m. Maximum number of guests: 145. Because guest numbers are limited, you are encouraged to select a tour on your registration form.

**MENU VARIATIONS:** Please specify if you require vegetarian or other specifics for your 2 evening meals.

<u>REGISTRATION FEES:</u> Early registration, prior to July 1, is encouraged and must be accompanied by payment. The earlier you register, the better your seat. Every effort will be made to accommodate late registrations, but priority dinner seating cannot be guaranteed.

**PAYMENT SUMMARY:** Please complete all information on the Registration Form and forward your payment. While checks are preferred, fees may be charged to VISA or MasterCard only. The 3 digit CVCC security number on the back of the card must be included. ONLY members of the Four Freshmen Society may attend this convention. Non-members will be allowed to join for a special fee of only \$10 (single or couple – please indicate) if submitted with a convention registration. # **My Gene Puerling Story**

Back in the 90s, I was deeply involved in converting all my favorite LPs to CD even though the technology was fairly new. I was convinced that record companies would never get around to releasing all my favorites, . . the Four Freshmen, the Hi-Lo's, the Axidentals, etc. So, I studied the subject, bought the necessary equipment and computer software and set out to convert all my albums. In those early days, it sometimes took a few solid weeks of work to remove the pops and clicks inherent in a single LP record album. Today, with improved software, I can do an album in as little as two hours.

After I finished all the Four Freshmen albums (I have my priorities), I went to work on the Hi-Lo's, transferring every album of theirs as well. At the time, this conversion process was all-consuming to me. Along the way I became acquainted with Frank D'Rone and still burn all the CDs his widow (Joan) sells on the Internet. Frank died of cancer this past fall but Joan still runs his website. Turns out that Frank knew Gene Puerling and, in fact, sat in for a few of the Singers Unlimited commercial gigs in Chicago replacing Len Dressler (another old Chicagoan) who sang bass for the SU. The SU were formed by Puerling strictly to sing commercials and "make a living".

So, Frank gave me Gene's address and I sent copies of all my Hi-Lo's CDs to Gene. Thus, we struck up an email friendship. Actually, back then it was more snail mail because the Internet was still a fairly new thing. Anyway, one LP I never had in stereo was the Hi-Lo's, *This Time It's Love*. Gene sent me his only copy which I promptly converted. It was a labor of love and took almost a month but this was for "the man." In all this time we only communicated my email and snail mail since he lived near San Francisco and I was in Chicago and cell phones were just evolving.

Then one New Year's morning (I think 1999), Kris (my wife) answered the phone and brought it to me at my computer. She said, "It's Gene," to which I replied, "Gene who?" Gene Puerling! I gulped and answered the phone. He was so gracious and we chatted for almost 20 minutes (which seemed like two to me). Here was a world renowned singer/ arranger who was so down to earth and friendly. He really reminded me of Ross Barbour with the same humble demeanor. He apologized for calling on New Years Day. The reason was to let me know that the next day I would probably get a call from a Sony producer and he didn't want it to be a surprise. Sony was about to release a CD of the Hi-Lo's album called Love Nest, but over the years their master tape had deteriorated (they take such great care, don't they)

they) so that two of the 12 tunes were non-recoverable. The two songs were *My Romance* and *Love Nest* (the album title song). They did still have the monaural tape of the album so Gene suggested they contact me because of the stereo CD I had produced. To me it was a great honor that he thought my work to be that good.


Gene told me that I should not give it away but I should be compensated for my efforts. That's the reason he called on a holiday. Sure enough, the next morning I got a call from some middle management Sony BS-er. We discussed the same issue about the missing two tracks in stereo. However, as soon as I mentioned that Gene told me to expect some compensation, this guy immediately cut me off and said he would get back to me on it. Of course, he never called back, just what I would expect from a so called "recording executive." When I told Gene about it, he laughed and said, "Welcome to the recording industry."

As you might expect, a month later that CD was released and I bought it even though I already had my own converted version since I wanted to compare the two. As I read the liner notes on the back, there was an asterisk by the song *Love Nest*, mentioned above and a note that described why that track was only mono. Since *My Romance* was all a cappella, they didn't mention that it was also in mono but assumed the listener wouldn't notice. I did right away, of course. Can you believe it? Hell, I would have been happy to just have my name mentioned in the liner notes but that arrogant so-and-so wasn't about to pay out any money (so he thought) to have a fully complete stereo album. He was probably worried it would be taken out of his commission. If you ever see it on the CD racks in stores, read the back side and you will see what I'm talking about. It's on a double album CD, paired with another Hi-Lo's gem, *All Over the Place*.

Anyway, that's my Gene Puerling story. We continued emailing infrequently over the following years until he passed away on March 25, 2008, just three plus years before our dear friend, Ross. The more I listen to his arrangements, the more I appreciate what he did. I'm convinced that many of the chords he chose were meant to express the words he was singing. He didn't follow any rules while arranging at the piano. He just played what sounded right to him. And, he really didn't play the piano, just sat down and dinked at it, like the rest of us.

I feel so lucky to have known both Gene and Ross Barbour who were personal heroes of mine. I expect they're both leading some heavenly vocal group and having a great time doing it.

#### "PROFESSOR" GREG STEGEMAN

A retired executive who has written for numerous publications and websites, he is a long-time Wisconsin and national Easter Seals volunteer and serves on the board of Easter Seals Wisconsin. Talking music with Greg Stegeman is like being in a college classroom. Ask a question and get an education. My education from "Professor" Stegeman started 20+ years ago when I learned Greg can help serious fans understand the special qualities of Four Freshmen songs. I had to smile appreciatively as Greg took the Wannabees into his "classroom" at the Four Freshmen Society 2013 convention.

The Four Freshmen have been harmonizing great songs since four guys from Indiana got together in 1948. We've heard many of those songs for many years. It's easy to take them for granted. But not just any piece of music can become a Four Freshmen song. Not every song "works." Greg Stegeman knows. Greg sang a dozen years with the Freshmen, most famously as the lead singer who followed Bob Flanigan, first when Flan was sidelined by a heart attack in 1990 and non-stop from 1992-1999 after Flan retired. That period included the much-hailed, hard-swinging FF Group #20. Greg has arranged a lot of FF songs and sung lots more. He knows what "works."

"It's a combination of two things. It has to be romantic in nature. The lyrics need to express a romantic interest. Musically it has to be harmonically rich. For that you have to go back to the standards," Greg told me. He mentions George Gershwin, Cole Porter and Harold Arlen as prime examples of composers who wrote songs that found a home in the Freshmen songbook.


Freshmen charts feature modern jazz harmonies, Greg points out. Siting Gershwin, Porter & Arlen he said, "the harmonies they use are sophisticated enough that the Freshmen approach seems very appropriate." The songs "have to be harmonically rich and you have to go back to the '30s, '40s & '50s for that. You get into the '60s and there were still guys who were writing new standards, like Johnny Mandel."

"The Freshmen deal with modern harmony, jazz harmony. More contemporary material – pop material – generally uses simple triads. The Freshmen sounds use the seventh of the chord rather than just the root, third and fifth that you hear in rock & roll and pop music," Greg told me.

There is another key factor. "There are a lot of great standards that perhaps have too much movement in them. The simple things work...where the phrases are long. Sustained notes, not a lot of eighth notes. Not a lot of movement. The sustained harmonies draw people's ears into that sound. It's really those three things. The harmonic sophistication, romanticism and the songs themselves – the melodies – (that) are relatively simple.

"A perfect example would be *It's a Blue World*. There's very little movement in that song. (sings) 'It's a Blue World without you...' It's all... sustained. Very little lyrical movement. So the sustained harmonies are what make the dynamic sound."

The Freshmen sound includes movement of the 2nd and 3rd voices within a chord.

"When you hear that movement they are making that chord change. Generally speaking, most standards have a chord change every two beats in a measure where there are four beats. In a typical ballad, every two beats there is a chord change. So that is what you're hearing when you hear those 2nd and 3rd parts move. They're making that chord change. Perhaps the lead melody will remain the same but the inner parts are making the chord change. That's where you hear the movement," Greg says.

"What people don't realize...is that up-tempo arrangements are much more difficult to learn. In a ballad, you have the luxury of sustaining that tone. There's some movement but it's not going by quickly. (In a song) like *Route* 66 it really takes a lot of rehearsal to get the up-tempo things together. (continued on page 10)

The irony is that when people think of the uptempo things they kind of think well, that must have been easy to do, because we're just swinging along. But all those things are harmonized. So something like *Route 66* when you are rehearsing, you have to do those parts as if they are ballads to make sure everyone knows what their part is and how it works and (get) all those chords lining up."

What is the most difficult arrangement the Freshmen ever sang? Greg knows what revered founding Freshman Ross Barbour believed.

"Ross said that *Midnight Sun* from *More Four Freshmen & Five Trombones* was the most difficult chart they ever did. In fact, they had to record it in phrases. It took them a while to get four bars. Then they had to stop and work on the next four bars."

What makes *Midnight Sun* so difficult?

"It's chromatic. That's all half-steps. (He sings) 'Your lips were like a red and ruby...' They're all very close tones, but they have to be really accurate. You have to start harmonizing that, too. The melody itself is very difficult. It's not an openly natural melody. Very chromatic. Very sophisticated harmony. We're talking Pete Rugolo arrangements. Probably more harmonically advanced than even Dick Reynolds ever got with the Freshmen. So it was really a challenge. Plus the melody is quite a (challenge). (He sings) 'Warmer than a midnight sun.' That interval is a major 7th. So the melody itself is very

difficult, and then you're harmonizing it with four parts. Sophisticated jazz harmony. I think that's what made it so difficult."

More Four Freshmen & Five Trombones has always been a favorite of this writer. It's a good example of the strength of "new standards" in the 1960s Greg mentioned. That album uses virtually all new-at-the-time songs that became major parts of the Great American Songbook. Ross Barbour once told me the Freshmen picked the songs for More Five Trombones "because they are great songs," without much thought to their durability.

Greg has his ideas about the most difficult arrangements he personally recorded with the Freshmen.

"I found *Their Hearts Were Full of Spring* to be really tough because it was A cappella and very sophisticated and everyone has to really nail their parts for it to really ring. And that's not enough. It's such an emotional song lyrically, too. You can't just sing the notes. It's a deeply emotional song and that was always a challenge. I've had the unique experience of singing both the top part and the third part on the arrangement and they're both really hard to do. And it's my favorite. I remember hearing it on the radio when I was in high school and it stopped me dead in my tracks."

Of the numerous charts he wrote for the group, Greg names *Where Do You Start* as his favorite. He concedes that his arrangement of *Unforgettable*, is the chart always mentioned by Freshmen fans. "Bob Flanigan himself said it was one of the greatest arrangements the Four Freshmen ever did so I carry that with me with great pride." He should! And we can all be grateful that more than a dozen years after he left the group, Greg Stegeman is still helping all of us understand that wonderful Four Freshmen "sound."

# A Valentine's Day Present: The Four Freshmen




