Thanks Brian & Hello Tommy

As you may have heard, 2015 marks the latest change in the Four Freshmen lineup. After a long and distinguished run with The Four Freshmen, Brian Eichenberger has decided to pursue other musical opportunities. I recently asked Brian if I could share his plans with the FFS membership, and he graciously agreed. In Brian's own words, and with his permission, I've reprinted the following email.

"Hey Neil.

The catalyst for me getting out of the group was when I heard through the grapevine that Brian Wilson needed a guy to sing the high parts in his live shows. I have always loved Beach Boys music, so when the opportunity to perform with one of my musical heroes came up, I grabbed it. For a few months, I tried to do both Brian Wilson/Four Freshmen shows, but there were inevitable conflicts. So I had to decide; I really can't perform with both groups; constantly subbing out my spot would interrupt the momentum of either group. So after 18+ years with the Freshmen, I decided it was time to try something different.

I started looking for a guy to replace me, and found Tommy through my old college instructor. (Tommy went through the same college I did, and is a teacher there for the rest of this year.) From what I've heard (continued on page 9)

Greetings from San Antonio!


The 2015 Four Freshmen Society Convention is approaching rapidly and you don't want to miss this one!



"He Speaks (sorta)!

...playing guitar and singing the second part, he's been in the band over thirteen months..." That's the running joke at shows, told during my introduction. Yep, I'm the new guy, and by a considerable margin. I was invited to share some thoughts about this past year with *FreshNews*. It would be impossible to describe such an eventful year without running long. However, there were a few things that really stood out to me, and I'd like to share those with you.

Thought #1: The soaring harmony and timeless melodies of The Four Freshmen masks the complexity the music brilliantly.

Translation: It's not easy to make it sound pretty (or easy). I don't know that I've ever worked so long and hard on repertoire in my entire life. But it all comes together, there just isn't anything like it.

Thought #2: Bob Ferreira has memory that rivals modern technology.

Since those days, I have heard them live in Port Huron, MI, Tampa, FL, Toledo, OH, and I hope to be in San Antonio next fall.




