

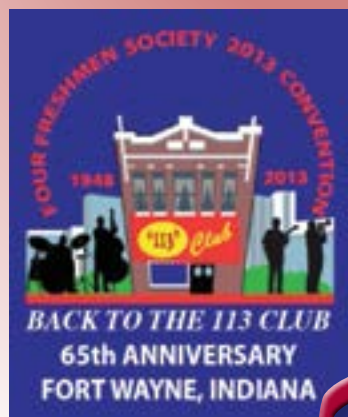
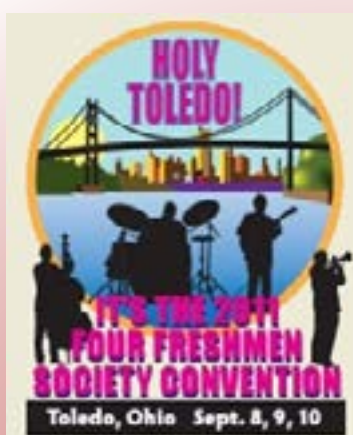

A Sentimental Journey Thru the Years

"Gonna take a sentimental journey. Gonna set my heart at ease. Gonna take a sentimental journey to renew old memories" and that is the reason why over 200 Four Freshmen Society members journeyed to the 34th annual Four Freshmen Society's Convention in Fort Wayne, Indiana, September, 2023.

How did these conventions come about? It was 1988 when Edd Townsend founded what was originally known as the Four Freshmen Appreciation Society. At a meeting with Bob Flanigan, Autie Goodman, Mike Beisner and Kirk Marcy in Fort Worth, Texas where the Freshmen were performing, Edd presented his idea to the Four. Bob Flanigan liked the idea and said "Okay Townsend...Let's do it." Thus the Society as well as the *Fresh News* newsletter was born and officially launched January 1, 1988. Many fans were anxious and excited to become members of the group. In later years the name Four Freshmen Appreciation Society was changed to The Four Freshmen Society.

Conventions have been held annually in various cities throughout the United States bringing members together from more than 40 states throughout the USA as well as from other countries outside the US. i.e. Denmark, Japan, Norway, Canada, the Netherlands, United Kingdom and others totaling 462 FFS members from outside the USA.

By attending FFS conventions hundreds of folks have helped support The Four Freshmen and made lasting friendships with one another and with the Freshmen themselves; now in their 76th year. Had it not been for the love of the Freshmen, their unique sound as well as those who have dedicated themselves in leadership roles as president, secretary, treasurer and the many volunteers who have spent hours keeping records and producing conventions, we may never have had the opportunity to hold the FFS convention in its final 34th year, as we have known conventions to be, or to have celebrated the 75th anniversary with a toast to The Four Freshmen.

The first line in Ecclesiastes 3:1, "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven, a time to weep and a time to love." FFS annual conventions will not be held as we have known them to be for the past 34 years. However, we have developed a plan in order to continue meeting with friends and fans before and after Four Freshmen concerts in your area, referred to as "The Gatherings." Now, isn't that *fresh news*, and isn't that great news?

One day in late 1990 or early 1991, I was in the store browsing through CDs looking to build my library of music on the then still new format, when I stumbled upon The Four Freshmen Capitol Collectors Series. Wow, here are the Freshmen's greatest hits in CD form! Naturally I bought it and couldn't wait to get home and listen to it. After reading the very informative liner notes, which filled in a few historical gaps for me, I saw an address for the Four Freshmen Appreciation Society. Wow, the Freshmen actually have a fan club! Of course I inquired and eventually joined. To my absolute delight, I found out they actually have an annual convention! Well that lead me to attending my first convention in Oshkosh, Wisconsin in the summer of 1991.

Over the next 30 plus years, these conventions have spanned Groups 17 through 27 while celebrating all the groups before them. They have taken me to 13 states through the midwest, south, east and western United States. Through these conventions I have gotten to know some wonderful people and make many friends, including most of the Freshmen!



A Memory From My First Convention in Oshkosh, WI, July, 1991:

After getting settled in I wandered into the hotel lobby not knowing or having met any FFAS members yet. I notice a tall gentleman had just checked in, maybe he's a member so I approach him and ask if he's a member of the FFAS, he replies: "Yes, I'm Palle Christensen from Denmark." And I thought I traveled far for this! Wow! Anyway Palle continues: "I think there's a few members in the bar, I'll join you shortly. Nice meeting you. See you shortly." So I wander over to the bar, grab a seat and order a beer. I notice a couple gentlemen conversing at the other end of the bar, maybe these are the members Palle was referring to, so I walk over and ask if they belong to the Four Freshmen Appreciation Society and one of them turns around and replies: "Yes, I'm Ross Barbour, please to meet you." And the other says "And I'm John Bangs. Pleased to meet you." Then I went numb!

They invited me to join them for a drink. I'm sitting at a bar next to Ross Barbour! Pinch me! So the first three Four Freshmen Society members I met in person were Palle Christensen, Ross Barbour and John Bangs in that order. Three people who played a vital role in the history of the Freshmen and the Society. And that was the start of 30 plus years of attending conventions!

Footnote from the editor: Yas inherited Bob Flanigan's trombone. Yas has also taken many photos throughout the years. He says he has 130,000 photos in his library.



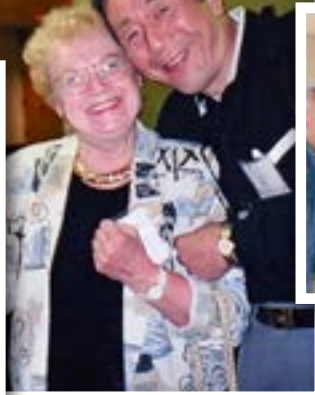


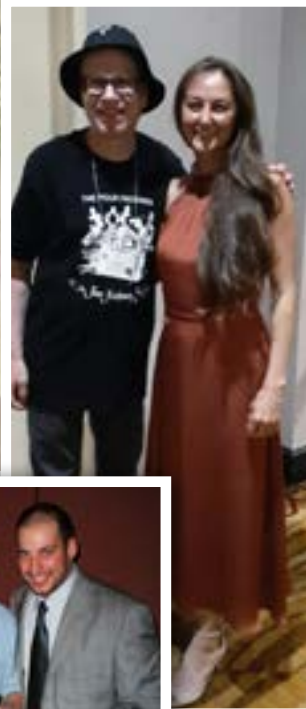
How Lucky We Have Been

What are FFS Gatherings?

Since the inevitable decline in our FFS membership has made annual conventions financially nonviable, we've come up with a plan where FreshFans (whether or not members of the FFS) can still gather to enjoy the music of The Four Freshmen and see their friends.

As The Freshmen perform around the country, we want to help increase ticket sales to make venues even more eager to book the guys. So we're helping to arrange what we call "Gatherings" coincident with Freshmen concerts. How it all works can be reviewed on the Four Freshmen Society website (fourfreshmensociety.com).

Here it is in a nutshell:

- Book tickets to a nearby Freshmen concert.
- Sign up for a Gathering held at a nearby hotel/restaurant/other venue.
- Get together there for a meet-and-greet with other FreshFans and perhaps sometimes with the Freshmen themselves.

That's all there is to it. We get to visit with one another and hear the guys, keeping our community and our support for The Four Freshmen going.

When you sign up for a Gathering on the FFS website (there's no cost), we'll keep you informed of other attendees. You contact each other to set up the Gathering and then just show up.

When you click the "[FFS Gatherings](#)" button on the FFS website, you'll get the chance to choose which concert(s) you plan to attend. As you "talk/text/email" among yourselves in the weeks before the Gathering, you'll work out the plan for when/where it will be, whether there will be refreshments and so forth.

Even if you just think you'll be able to attend one or more, sign up and we'll keep you in the loop.

To see if there is a concert nearby (check often): Go to the "[Tour Schedule](#)" on the FFS website.
