### Tribute to a True Freshmen Fan

### **Barbara (Pleischl) Frederich**

November 8, 1939 – April 30, 2019

On April 30, I lost one of my long-time friends, Babs Frederich. We both were in our early teens when we were captivated by the unique, haunting sound of the Four Freshmen! Babs, who lived in Cleveland, started one of the first local FF fan clubs in the early 1950s and, because of her talents and enthusiasm, soon became national vice-president of "The Freshies."

In 1954, I inquired about starting a Freshmen fan club in Pittsburgh and began receiving letters from Babs (all her correspondence ended in "Forever More for the Four"). This was the start of a long-lasting friendship. Our families met and exchanged several visits between Cleveland and Pittsburgh in those early years.

In 1957, Bill Wagner became the group's personal manager and reorganized the Four Freshmen fan club. He launched the first-ever newsletter, called "The Fifth Freshman." Babs Pleischl was appointed national president, and Dot Matviya became national vice-president. This newsletter was the main connection between the Freshmen and their fans for over twenty years. In the meantime, Babs married Wayne Frederich and moved to Tallahassee, FL.

Much later, in the 1990s, the Four Freshmen Society became the official "fan club." Babs served on the Board of FFS until 2013, when she was awarded the title of "FFS Corporate Board of Directors Emeritus."

Beginning with the original Four Freshmen (Bob, Ross, Don and Hal), Babs met and encouraged all of the FF groups, until about six years ago. She attended most of the FFS

conventions with her husband, Wayne, until he passed away on May 1, 2014.

Babs was a true and faithful Four Freshmen fan, working tirelessly to promote their music for over 60 years. She will be greatly missed by all who knew her.

Jim was a Regional Representative with the Balfour Ring Company for many years. He had Balfour design a special "Four Freshmen Society" watch for us and made them available in the 113 Club each year. Although I have several watches, the FFS watch has always been my favorite.

Jim introduced his lovely future wife Candy to the Four Freshmen family at the Grand Rapids Convention in 2005. I don't think she had any idea at that time the impact that event would have on their lives. We were all together several years later on a jazz cruise when he proposed to Candy and they were married not long after that. They were wonderful for each other and Marsha and I shared many delightful times with the two of them each year.

I always cherish our friendship each time I look at my watch and I will remember my wonderful friend, Jim Bell. We will always miss you, Jim, more than you could ever know.

Dave Steinmeyer had a concert at Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. They had, as their guests, The Four Freshmen (group 6). That concert was preserved from the sound board by Dave Barnes. It was then cleaned up by Paul Halac. The result was a "new" CD of the Four Freshmen Live at Constitution Hall in 1979, backed by the Airmen of Note, the premier jazz ensemble of the U.S. Air Force. The Music Mart has embarked on a plan to find and release these rare recordings, particularly in years when there is no new CD from the Freshmen themselves. 

### Your Freshmen Society Membership Department

How's that for an article title to encourage you to turn the page as fast as you can? :)

The FFS Membership department is the nuts and bolts deep in side the FFS machine. I thought you might like to know how it all works.

Still reading? Here we go...

First, the "FFS Membership Department" is just me; running it takes about 15 hours every week.

The job has two major elements: managing the memberships worldwide and leading the State Rep/Regional Directors organization.

#### The database

Currently we have more than 1,300 members world-wide. Each family has a record in the database with demographic information and membership history. The system "knows" when each member's dues are due so it sends a reminder the month before; those who have email get the reminder that way as well as a postcard.

When someone pays their dues, I update the database with the new renewal date and that triggers a "thank-you" email or letter acting as the receipt.

When someone new joins the FFS, I add them to the database. This triggers a new member packet welcoming them to the FFS.

Each quarter when Fresh News is published, I provide the mailing labels to the printer for those of you still receiving FreshNews in the mail. At the same time, I email those who have "opted out" of the mailed version in favor of reading Fresh News online.

### **Dues processing**

When members pay their dues, I receive those checks (or emails which I acknowledge with a reply). I prepare the checks for deposit and make entries in this month's spreadsheet. The online (credit card) renewals and new member applications are added to the spreadsheet as well. This happens daily at the same time I update the member's renewal date.

After the end of the month, I process the credit cards that have come in during the month and send that information to our Treasurer and personally deposit the checks. If you've wondered why a check you wrote early in the month doesn't clear the bank until the next month, that's why!
