FFS MISSION STATEMENT **Report for the Fresh News** by Dick Baldwin, President

The initial item of business at our annual Executive Meeting of the Four Freshmen Society at Portland, OR. August 2, 2007, was a timely "Mission Statement." Modified to comply with the unanimous approval of those in attendance, the following document resulted for the Society's ongoing support of the Four Freshmen.

FYI the Executive Meeting includes: Corporate Board, FFS Officers, Regional Directors, International Directors, Special Assignment Personnel, plus the Advisory Council (previously known as Advisors/Trustees). This entire voluntary administration traditionally meets during each convention weekend for the purpose of updating all functions of the Four Freshmen Society.

THE FOUR FRESHMEN SOCIETY **Mission Statement** R. E. Baldwin

The Four Freshmen Society Incorporated, originally known as the "Four Freshmen Appreciation Society" until 1992, remains an active, international network of approximately 3,000 members. The FFS serves as a promotional and supporting regional and international organization to sustain the Four Freshmen jazz vocal group sound, which first performed professionally in 1948.

The society retains a Corporate Board of Directors, President, Treasurer, Membership Chair, an Advisory Council, plus specific project chairs. All administration leadership is initiated by the Corporate Board.

The Society schedules an annual convention for its members in a designed weekend format. Sites are determined and committee chaired by FFS members with approval by a Selection Committee and the Board. Annual executive, business and other special organizational meetings are part of each convention/reunion agenda.

The Society offers its cooperation to a professional management agency to schedule FF concerts and appearances. The professional management agreement is determined by the Four Freshmen Corporation, exclusive of the Four Freshmen Society.

All FFS administration and assignments are voluntary. Financial matters are first directed by the Society Corporate Board before being concluded by the President and Treasurer.

A quarterly publication, Fresh News, is edited and distributed to the Society as the primary conduit for the membership and recruitment of new members.

Springfield Summer Arts Show by Dick Hatfield, Ohio Rep.

On the first evening of summer, June 21, the Four Freshmen sang to over two thousand people, outdoors, at Veterans Park, in my hometown of Springfield, Ohio. They were fantastic!

It was the second night of our Summer Arts Festival, an annual five-week-long series of music, dance, and Broadway plays.

Many Society members from near and far were amid the fans. Among those enjoying the Fresh air were Tom and Delee Purvis from Sandusky, Mel and Barbara Meyers from Toledo, and the Dot and Harry Lydic clan fom Pittsburgh, just to mention a few.

After sundown, the platform lights got brighter and brought about an assortment of flying bugs to center stage, some of which Bob and Brian chortled "tasted just like chicken!"

All in all, it was perfect music by a perfect foursome on a perfect evening.

The performance was sponsored by the Juergens family in memory of Tim Juergens who passed away in early Spring. Tim was a longtime Four Freshmen Society member, who, along with his wife, Jackie, attended almost all the conventions and cruises. He was a man who treasured his music, particularly that of the Four Freshmen.

FFS Annual Executive Committee Meeting 8-2-07

FFS President Dick Baldwin opened the meeting by asking Jack Morrison for a report from Convention Selection Committee. Jack then introduced Gil Peterson, who represents the Portland Convention Committee, and he welcomed FFS to Portland. Mel Meyers, also from the Convention Section Committee, introduced the chairpersons for the 2008 convention - Neil and Sara Lou Lantz. Neil and Sara brought us up to date on their plans for Indianapolis next year. They are speaking with the Indianapolis Jazz Orchestra regarding the Freshmen singing with the band - yet to be resolved. The hotel name is changing from the Radisson to the Sheraton in downtown Indianapolis, but the change will not affect their plans. The dates for 2008 convention will be Aug. 21-23. Neil stated that the only transportation from airport to hotel will be by taxi. He is still negotiating with Butler University to take part in the 60th anniversary celebration during 2008 convention/reunion.

<u>Membership/Webmaster</u> - Chaz Cone stated that the total membership of FFS is declining - 60 fewer new members in 2006 compared to 2005. How can we improve these numbers? Many drop out or do not renew. Why? Chaz thought that members feel they don't get much out of the society if they do not attend conventions or are not able to see FF live in their areas very often, if ever. Graphs passed out with new member info in back of handout. Credit cards not as big as predicted even though easy to use.

Membership Dept. spends approx. \$2,000 per year for postage, cards, etc. Re: State Reps. - many don't do very much. They should be communicating with members who live in areas where concerts take place & they should be encouraging new people to sign up.

Palle Christensen reported that only 11% of the new members who signed up in Amsterdam have renewed. Problem for Europeans - cannot renew with credit card or purchase items from Music Mart with credit card. Yas Ichiura also reported a decline in Japanese membership. Barb Dana suggested a program to make special mention of the State Rep in Fresh News who gets the most new members or renewals every 3 months to encourage the reps to do more. Regional Directors are working - need one to represent the West as that position currently open.

<u>Radio & Digital Music</u> - Do we want to push satellite radio? Jack Morrison said we have a member who is a program director for satellite radio. Mel Meyers even sent a letter to the director of XM radio requesting more play of FF music & sent some CD 's along, too. That person thought the Freshmen were a "ghost band." You Tube utilized by younger folks - Chaz said the three FF videos put on the site here have had more than 11,000 hits (viewings) collectively, so far.

<u>Music Mart</u> - Bob Lininger not in meeting room - over in Music Mart working. All agreed he is doing good job & acts promptly to fill orders. Dick Baldwin brought up Tantara Production with the Kenton connection, which is owned by Bill Lichtenour, who is a member of FFS. Should we sell Kenton stuff in our Music Mart? Babs Frederich suggested that we carry an ad in Fresh News for Tantara products rather than actually sell the Kenton material ourselves, and request that the Tantara newsletter do the same for Freshmen music.

<u>Marketing</u> - Need to market FF to younger audiences. High School clinics are good way to do it. Barb Dana's husband put together a narrative on how to promote clinics - he actually did some clinics in Florida. Dina & Charlie (of IVI) said it could be a good thing for the Freshmen and would be willing to work with FFS members to do this, but have not gotten requests for clinics. Mel Meyers stated that he offered to "buy" a clinic for FF at the high school in Maumee, OH, on the Mon. following a Freshmen performance in the area.

<u>Promotional Ideas</u> - What about bumper stickers? Most people do not want to attach them to their cars. Giving copies of the FF Star Spangled Banner to the athletic directors of high schools is great promotion. Many times they do not have live person available to sing National Anthem and appreciate having the recorded FF version on hand. Plenty of copies on hand for anyone who wants to use this idea.

<u>Meeting Time for future Executive Meetings</u> - Does Thurs. afternoon work out for most members of the Executive Committee? Should we plan for this day and time for Indianapolis? Most agreed with Thurs. afternoon as most of this group always arrives early for conventions.

<u>Closing Comments</u> - Jack Morrison said that Gil Peterson suggested that all former FF be invited to attend 60th anniversary convention in 2008 with FFS paying expenses rather than convention committee. Babs F, agreed that we should invite all former FF and consider how to handle expenses of those who decide to come. (Meeting adjourned.)

A Little History by Dick Baldwin, President

The Four Freshmen Appreciation Society was founded by Edd Tounsend (Elizabethton TN). In 1987, after Bob Flanigan gave him "The FF Approval", Edd served as CEO from 1987-1990.

In 1990 Edd resigned and, our one and only John Bangs assumed the presidency. Based in Oshkosh WI, John expanded our society and our fan club changed its name to "The Four Freshmen Society".

From 1990 - 1996 John was an excellent leader, moving FFS to rapidly growing membership and fiscal stability. At this time John recruited Freshfan Chick Trafford to produce our society newsletter - *Fresh News.* The newsletter has been an invaluable tool in the presentation of THE FRESHMEN SOUND.

After seven years at the FFS helm, John resigned the presidency . . . passing the baton to Theodore D. Driscoll (Elyria OH). Ted held the office from 1996-1998.

Ted continued the excellent leadership and played a major part in the nomination and selection of THE FOUR FRESHMEN to the Vocal Group Hall of Fame (based in Sharon PA).

Another one of Ted's accomplishments was the initiating of major financial support for the freshmen.

Don Follett (Shoreview MN) took over the presidency in 1998-2000. Again the society was greatly enhanced by Don's leadership and people skills.

Next my immediate predecessor was inaugurated as president in 2000, serving five years! Thomas A. Purvis (Sandusky OH)

During the full term of his leadership the society grew in worldwide membership, and tangible support for THE FRESHMEN increased to unprecedented heights.

Editor's note: After faithful service he helped the society by suggesting that the strides made to improve our business strategies be continued. He recruited long time fan and college administrator Richard E. Baldwin (Williamsville NY) to run for election to the presidency of FFS.

President, Dick Baldwin welcomed all FFS members present and briefly touched on the Mission Statement of FFS. He then announced that IVI is arranging for public TV stations (PBS) to run the 60 minute Four Freshmen "Live In Las Vegas" DVD sometime from December 2007 through March 2008.

Neil & Sara Lou Lantz are working to get a place at Butler University where Four Freshmen archives can be deposited and held in Indianapolis. An archivist for the FF and FFS is needed to take care of this project.

Dick Baldwin introduced Chaz Cone, Membership Director

He stated that membership is declining - FFS members need to encourage friends & neighbors to join - he said each member should try to get four new people to join, as this is our main source of revenue - dues. He explained the system of four Regional Directors and State Reps. FFS is made up of 1536 households and approx 3,000 members. Japanese members account for 200+ and Europe of 100+.

All State Reps present were recognized.

Treasurer's Report

Jim Whitmire noted that dues revenue and Music Mart revenue are slowly declining but contributions are up. The recent FF DVD ate up much of the treasury, but the return from it is coming back into treasury. Jim explained that the required clearances to produce the video are very costly - approx. \$32,000 so far, and the FFS paid about \$4,000 for new arrangements for the Freshmen with bands. Question - should we make a CD of the DVD to sell? Chaz Cone mentioned that much of the same material is available on the current CD, but someone mentioned that we can't play the DVD in the car, and since the DVD is a live performance, it would be different. Much legal "stuff" would be involved - may even need to be "re-cleared". Jim Whitmire reported that the newsletter costs about \$3,700 per issue to. print and send. Question - What about putting the newsletter "on line" only? Approx. 50% of FFS members are on line now, but many members do not want to drop printing the Fresh News on paper. That could drive people away if they do not have a paper newsletter.

Question- Does the reduced fee of \$10.00 for new members to join at concerts pay for itself? Chaz answered that if renewals follow, yes.

Question- On the renewal form, could you indicate whether you want Fresh News on paper or on line? Dick Baldwin said we should check with Chick, as costs go down as volume increases. Wayne Frederich said for future reference, we should always consider small increases in dues more often rather than a big increase once in awhile. Ann Smith said "What about a small item in the newsletter about donations to make people aware of the options for giving to FFS? Trudy Feigum's husband asked about foundations - he said that Trudy and Johanna Stegeman had volunteered to research that possibility some time ago but

no one asked them to pursue it. Dick Baldwin stated that we are a Net Corp. (normal for non-profit corp) - could not find a way for non-profit 501-3C with how we support the FF.

IVI & BOOKING THE FRESHMEN

Dick Baldwin introduced Dina Sheets Roth from California and IVI. She announced that they are working on distribution for the Freshmen of their "Live IN Vegas" DVD to PBS stations for their fund raising programs. This will be great exposure for the Freshmen. With the 60th anniversary coming up, Mel Meyers will be working on a major national print, press for the FF.

Jack Morrison asked Dina if the State Reps. should contact the PBS stations regarding the showing of the DVD. Dina replied, "Yes, with a COORDINATED effort, but not all stations will run the DVD and they will not all do it at the same time."

Question - How much do the FF require for a show? Dina answered that there are many variables, such as the size of the venue, whether they are doing another show nearby. Costs may include hotel rooms, transportation, lighting, sound, etc. She said she did not wish to state any particular dollar amount for public consumption. Bob Ferreira is now renting drum sets which saves him a great deal of time and physical wear & tear.

Question- Does FFS provide membership information at the CD table at concerts? Yes - adding more workers at each table too. The DVD will not be an exclusive "members only" item with PBS. Anyone can order it from the web site or from our Music Mart. Chaz asked Dina about the possibility of selling large number of DVD's & Dina said she could help with that, plus we know that Brian has the capability to make more if needed. Dina stated that the Freshmen have done well with symphony orchestras -performing with 3 of them during the past year. She said they are currently on a "community concert tour" of the U.S. which was set up thru a booking agent who does this for many communities at once.

Question regarding marketing to colleges re: clinics/workshops - Dina said they are doing some now, but many colleges no longer have jazz programs, but she would like to see more of this type of activity for the FF. A member from Tucson told Dina about the "Opening Minds Through Arts" program in his city and Dina said she would like to see more of this type of activity and would look into it. The Freshmen always get great response when working with kids, and the kids love it.

A California member inquired about the "Fair circuit" for the FF. Dina replied that the FF aren't doing many, but she would look at that possibility. Someone asked about the FF getting appearances on the Late Night Talk Shows, etc. It appears that the response has not been good from the talk shows - want "young, hip artists. Duh? That's exactly what they are! Member asked "What about youtube?" The stuff on there is old, he replied. Chaz has put up some new stuff and there have been more than 10,000 hits on the FF site there.

Dick B. introduced Wayne Corey who briefed us on the "Truth In Vocal Group Legislation." Let Wayne know if this item comes up in your state, and he will research it. In Wisconsin it is worded OK because it says that the group is permitted to perform if it is authorized by the Corporation that owns the group. In Illinois, the way the predicted legislation would be worded says that the group must include at least one original member of the group; therefore, the FF could not perform there! (legally, that is.) We need to watch for these new state laws which could affect all of us.

Dick reminded FFS members that giving copies of the FF singing the National Anthem to athletic directors is great P.R. and the athletic directors love it.

He also urged all FFS members to vote the Freshmen into the Downbeat Hall of Fame by going to the website for Downbeat, and filling out the ballot on line, as that is the only way you can vote this year. Only one ballot by each E-mail address.

CONVENTION SELECTION COMMITTEE

Jack Morrison explained the purpose and duties of the Convention Selection Committee which includes himself, Mel Meyers and Bruce Camlin. He praised the Portland committee for their organization and for following the guidelines laid out by the Selection Committee.

Jack introduced Neil & Sara Lou Lantz who will be heading up the Convention Committee in Indianapolis for 2008. They gave us the following information:

Dates for 2008 will be Aug. 21st - Aug. 23rd

- Hotel will be the Radisson (soon to change name to Sheraton)
- Hotel location is downtown, one half block from City Center District
- Room rate will be \$109 per night
- Thurs. night will return to traditional "Jam Session"

Fri. night will include The Indianapolis Jazz Orch.

which specializes in Kenton arrangements & hopefully will do some songs with the FF.

Sat. night will feature the Freshmen.

A tour of the city will be offered & will include a catered lunch plus a VIP tour of the Indy 500 Speedway

2009 convention will be in Atlanta with Chaz & Gael Cone heading up the committee.

2010 is open and proposals will be accepted sometime around April. If any members are interested in pursuing hosting a convention in 2010, they can get a packet of information on how to prepare a proposal from Jack Morrison. Good turnout for this meeting and many good ideas discussed.

Hope to see everyone in Indianapolis in 2008.

KEN ALBERS: A Silent Man Who Had Very Much To Say by Mike Collins, Texas

On stage, John Kenneth Albers always was the member of the Four Freshmen who had little or nothing to say. Off stage, he was simply a magnificent conversationalist.

Back about 1970 I had the pleasure of sharing a table for two with Ken for a between show buffet at the Cincinnati Playboy Club, where the FF were performing.

This was during the Liberty years when the FF were staying alive, commercially, by singing some surprisingly good arrangements out of many trite popular compositions. During the course of our meal, I spoke with Ken about the changes in instrumentation, musical selection and other facets of the business in an era of the decline of jazz and the British invasion.

What continues to impress me today is the knack that Ken had in grasping how much I would absorb...his words neither went sailing over my head nor dumbdowned to elementary school level. Since I had not seen the FF in person since the loss of the Capitol recording contract, there was a lot of catching up to do in a brief timeframe...maybe 20 minutes.

Until a few years ago, I had always thought that Ross Barbour scripted most of the "patter" jokes within the group. Not so, according to Ross. Ken not only composed, arranged, and actually taught Group #3 more advanced concepts, but also provided the plurality of the humor.

Like the National Basketball Association's champion San Antonio Spurs, Ken was the consummate team player who simply made things better. He had a great deal to say in more ways than most of his fans realize.

And So It's Over...NOT!

All things good always have a way of ending. That's what happened to us in that Barbara Meyers has retired from her position of Nevada State Rep., and Mel Meyers has retired from his position of Arizona State Rep. and Director of the West Region for FFS.

We leave these positions with "heavy heart" as they say. We have been traveling the Western states trying to keep up with the most engaging young men in the business. We have enjoyed every minute of the casinos, lounges, bars, theaters, outdoor arenas, RV sites, cruises and meeting with the local supportive society members at the gigs and sending out occasional notices to the memberships and the state reps reminding them of coming events, etc. We are not leaving the FFS, however, but will of course see you all in Portland. We enjoy these conventions because we get to see all of you. I shall continue on with supporting the Convention Requirements Committee as required.

We have elected to return to our roots, namely Toledo Ohio, as permanent residents. We expect to be active from there catching up to the Guys when they work this area and as requested by FFS management.

We appreciate the support given the Guys by the West States Members and thank them for that.



Just a note from my wife (Susan) and me to tell you we just returned from The Elkhart (IN) Jazz Festival, and what a joy it was to attend all three performances of the Four Freshmen. Without doubt, they were the absolute best of all groups at the Festival as well as drawing the largest crowds at every session.

All three performances were at different times of the day and/or at a different setting, and there were very few duplicates in the programs. As the Freshmen sound continues to improve with age over the years, it even happened in Elkhart in a space of two days. They were really in top form, and the mix of old standards along with some newer arrangements made for a marvelous treat.

We date back to the original group at Butler, although both of us are Indiana University grads. After listening to some of the early 50's and down through the years recordings, the "In Session" CD we just purchased in Elkhart is a real testimony to the fact that the Freshmen sound is alive, well and continually getting better, This current group is just flat out tremendous. Each brings a special talent to the gathering

Trish, Hans and Phil were joined by Ken French on drums to provide some excellent backing for the other performers that came to entertain the FF fans. Suzanne Dumawe returned to sing for us. Many of you will remember her from Pittsburgh when her CD player, that she planned to use for backup, failed and Curtis came to her rescue with a nice piano accompaniment, much to her surprise and relief. Barbara Lusch from Portland treated us to her vocal talents and Gail Pettis was another recent FFS member who offered some very excellent vocalizing to a very attentive audience. Two of Trish's long time fans Jim Richeson and Gardner Taylor had a great time with a vocal duet that everyone enjoyed. Some say this was the best jam session yet at a Four Freshmen convention.

The opening acts for both of the FF concerts were bands that Trish regularly performs with and each is totally different from the other so there was not too much of any one group. Both were very well received as was Trish and this was evidenced by the number of her new CDs that were purchased through the efforts of Music Mart Director, Bob Lininger. Of course Trish is a FFS member who is fast becoming well known by other society members. Trish also shared her groups with those who wished to stay and listen or dance after the planned FF concerts and this was a first for these conventions. An added attraction also on one evening following the Four Freshmen concert was an 18 piece big band called the Swing Machine led by Art Abrams who's name was unfortunately misspelled in the program and we apologize to Art for that error. That error however did not diminish the performance of that band and more dancers than were expected took the opportunity to use the portable dance floor that was placed adjacent to the stage.

All in all, this convention went off without a blemish and the comments from those who ventured to Portland indicated that this was one of the best conventions ever if not the best. The Portland 2007 host committee can be proud of their accomplishment. Each member took on tasks that were mostly new to them and worked hard to make it all fit together. This included the registrars, John and Barbara Osterholm, publicity and promotion Loren Knutsen, acquiring the goodie bags Shirley Maney, venue selection Dick Bass, organizing the bus tour of Portland Fred Dorsett, the making of the centerpieces Carmen Merritt, procuring the red polo shirts Bill Wilson, the idea of the gift coffee mugs from Music Director Trish Hatley. Legal advice retired lawyer Dan Ellis also served as moderator of our committee meetings. Keeping of the records Secretary Rodger Magnuson and keeping the whole program moving was done by Co-Chairs Gil Peterson our treasurer with the help of Marsha Leaptrott and Keith Rydman our hotel coordinator.

The design artwork chosen for the gift mugs was the program cover art by Dan de la Torre on one side and the first ever LP record jacket of the FF Voices In Modern from 1954 on the opposite side.
