FFS Remembers Palle Christensen

With the death of Palle Christensen have we lost the greatest fan of The Four Freshmen ever. And we have lost a good friend.

In many ways, Palle was "The great Dane." His influence on FFS, as European Director through 25 years, is well known. Among other things, he was one of the anchormen behind the successful FF-Convention in Amsterdam, Holland, August 2005.

For his contribution for the Danish Society, he received from our Queen Margrethe's own hand, an Order in Merit in silver. An event he loved to tell us about, first of all because our tall Queen, very unusually, under the audience, got up from her chair and looked Palle directly into his eyes.

First time I learned about Palle was in the beginning of the 80's, as he found me by phone in Norway. Like me, he had for many years believed that he was the only guy with that silly love for an American vocal-group called The Four Freshmen. In reality, we must have been sitting together in the first row, by the one and only concert July 1966, in Tvoli, Copenhagen, with Bob, Bill, Ross and Ken.

Palle was the owner of a total LP-collection with our heroes. (One more record than I have, and he would tease me)

We first time met was in Las Vegas at the first FF-Convention in 1988, and since then, at a vast number of Conventions all over, plus privately in Copenhagen with his wife, Lis, and their son, Jesper.

Palle was no singer or musician, but he loved Jazz and knew all about it. Now, hundreds of Danish jazzfriends will miss his pleasant voice, as he once a week through more than 20 years has been DJ on the

Copenhagen Jazz Radio in his own broadcast called "The vocal-hour." A broadcasting where Palle never missed any opportunity to play a number or two of his beloved favourites. I had the joy to be with him and take part in these programs several times and remember it with a big smile.

All honour to the memory of Palle.

Dear Freshmen fans,

You might have been informed of this very sad news that Palle Christensen, Copenhagen Denmark, passed away in the morning of June 30, 2014 due to sudden heart embolism. His wife Lis and son Jesper immediately informed me by e-mail and they hadn't seen any sign of his illness and had difficult time to accept it.

Palle has been my first, longest and one of the best friends among FFS for almost quarter of a century. When The Four Freshmen toured in Japan late 1990, I followed the group at three different venues. I was so lucky to share breakfast table with Bob Flanigan at a hotel restaurant in Nagoya.

Among others, he told me there was a guy just like me in Denmark and it was Palle, as I frequently visited Sweden on business at that time. I asked John Bangs, FFAS president, to let me know Palle's address, and I sent Palle a snail mail letter. After exchanging a few letters, I visited him in Copenhagen in 1991. He offered me a drive around the city of Copenhagen for sight-seeing, however, I asked him to stay at his home to listen to his FF library. We enjoyed our common interest and became good friends very easily. I have to admit that his FF library was larger than mine.

Palle had been the very first FF fan to get together with me in Las Vegas and we had a very good time around the pool at Bob Flanigan's home in late 80s. He was so proud of attending the meeting, which became a start of FFS Conventions. My first FFS Convention was in Columbus, Ohio, 1992. Since then, Palle and I shared a hotel room at several conventions, until my wife Michiko joined me. He liked to sleep in bed with three ends of blanket be tightly folded under the mattress, just as if he slipped into a blanket envelope. On the other hand, I pull out the blanket from the mattress to make my feet free to move to any direction. We often laughed about the different preference in bed.

When I joined FFAS (so called at that time), everybody, including Palle, asked me if "FF in Tokyo '68" LP would be available. So, I started to visit second hand record shops in my area for that album, but, no success. I also made some FFS friends in Japan and talked about "FF in Tokyo '68" LP. One very kind guy, Susumu Ohnuki, offered to give that album from his FF collection to Palle. As far as I remember, Palle made an international call to thank him

and me, right after he received the surprise LP package from Japan.

When FF toured in Europe one time in late 90's, he became a voluntary roadie mostly in Holland. He later told me very nice anecdotes with the guys, especially Mike Beisner. Every time he comes to a FFS Convention, he brings a bottle of Scandinavian strong spirit for Bob Flanigan, who was so happy and appreciated Palle for the nice gift.

He called himself a "Bathroom Singer" and didn't sing much at Wannabee sessions, but he surely enjoyed seeing people trying to sing FF songs. He was very well informed especially about vocal harmony groups and he acted as voluntary disk jockey at a radio program in Copenhagen. I received several copies of his program in cassette tape, and enjoyed playing it, even though he spoke in Danish. I could figure out what he was talking about, as I could recognize some artists names.

I used to visit Sweden on my business and Copenhagen was my airport to arrive and leave from Sweden. He often came to my departure gate to say hello, as he worked at SAS airlines in Copenhagen airport. At that time, only travelers were allowed to go inside terminal buildings, except qualified people like airline employees. One day, while I was on a ferry boat from Malm, Sweden to Copenhagen, I heard It Never Occurred To Me by The Four Freshmen on background music. I think that was my first experience to hear The Four Freshmen as background music. I was so excited and wanted to tell this story to somebody. Later, I was walking inside the big airport terminal building. Somebody touched my shoulder from behind. Of course, it was Palle. He was the very right person to tell my recent experience in the ferry boat. I tried to let him know my flight back to Japan in advance.

I looked for his photos in my entire photo library saved in my Mac and found 109 of them (good or bad), which are now shared at the following link: https://www.icloud.com/photostream/#A2GWUKf SG4nZCa. I tried to sort by date and I did mostly. Click any of the photos, then it will appear in larger size. Then, click right or left arrow key on your keyboard to move to next one. Wait for a second to see sharper images.

On the last day of each FFS Convention, Palle and I had a routine to say "See you next week!" as we thought one year is as short as a week and we can talk to each other so easily after one year time. I recall his happy and smiling face each time we find each other and come closer to hug. I really miss him as this won't happen again.

I thank Palle madly for being a very good friend of mine for more than 20 years. I wish he will enjoy another life in Heaven and want to hug him when I get there.

This year we had "Fresh Memories" instead of the usual "Fresh Talk." The various participants included two Freshmen widows and several former Four Freshmen. They told us interesting and unusual tales of the Four Freshmen, according to what they thought would be interesting to us.

Sue Barbour decided to tell us what happened to the Four Freshmen in 1956, since this was a particularly eventful year for them. In January, the Barbours bought a house. In March, Ken Albers replaced Ken Errair. That was the year that the Four Freshmen did the tour with the Ted Heath Orchestra. Notables in the lineup included June Christy and Nat King Cole. That was the tour when Nat King Cole got attacked by a deranged concert attendee in Mississippi. It was unnerving to him and he was visibly shaken, though he recovered from the attack alright.

April 19 was Don Barbour's birthday. At the party for Don, Ted Heath (from England) was asked what impressed him the most about the United States. His reply was, "The size of Texas."

The record company had been saving the Freshmen release of *Graduation Day* to have it come out closer to graduation time. Word came down that the Rover Boys were about to release a recording of this song, so the record company got the Four Freshmen version released really quickly.

At a Salt Lake amusement park, Ross was having trouble trying to play badminton and collapsed. Three weeks later, he was diagnosed with type 1

diabetes. He was in the hospital for two weeks and only weighed 124 pounds when he got out.

1956 was also the year that Elvis was on the Ed Sullivan Show for the first time. Ray Anthony had a TV show and

the Four Freshmen were on it. In Sue's words, it was not a big success. According to her, they had to do "dumb" choreography, which didn't work, and they ended up quitting the show.

In order to stay employed, the Four Freshmen started doing one-nighter college tours. This proved to be a big success for them. The college kids loved the Four Freshmen and the Freshmen sound.

Sue ended her comments by saying that in 1957 they sold their house, moved to California, and became Californians.

Nancy Albers, widow of Ken Albers, shared her memories with us next. She had never traveled with the Freshmen because she always stayed home with the kids. The first time she did, it was a 17-day cruise, which included their three children. The Freshmen party were the only passengers on board besides the crew. They went through the Panama Canal on this cruise.

She also related how Ken was not a big talker, especially on stage. The one reply the other guys could get out of him was his famous response to any question: "My girdle's killing me." Nancy said it's on several CDs.

Bill Comstock regaled us with a tale that he thought was particularly humorous. A friend asked him after a performance if the Freshmen would come to his

Four Freshmen Society: 27 YEARS

Noting that we've welcomed nearly a thousand new members to the Society since 2010, I thought it might be time for a short lesson on the history of the organization.

Originally named the Four Freshmen Appreciation Society, the Four Freshmen Society was formed in October of 1987 by Edd Townsend in order to celebrate, promote, and perpetuate the unique Freshmen sound created at the Butler University Jordan Conservatory of Music in Indianapolis in 1948. The Society is a non-profit organization which has grown over the past 27 years in an effort to keep members abreast of the activities of the Four Freshmen. The Society got off to a quick start by publishing its first newsletter, Fresh News, in January of 1988; and by the end of the month, 150 Freshmen fans became dues-paying members of the Society. Edd was the first President and served until 1990. He was then succeeded by John Bangs who retired in 1996 and was followed by Ted Driscol and Don Follett. Early leadership was also provided by Board Chairman Dave Bentley and by the late Charles (Chick) Trafford who served for years as Vice President and as Editor of Fresh News for over two decades. Our current Chairman of the Board, Tom Purvis, served as President from 2000 – 2005, followed

The first FFS Convention was held in Las Vegas in September of 1988 and has been followed since at various locations around the country and one year in Amsterdam, Netherlands. The 27-year uninterrupted roadmap has taken our membership as far west as Portland, OR (2007); as far east as Annapolis, MD (2010); north to Oshkosh, WI (1991, 1994, 1999); and south this year to Tampa, Florida. The fiftieth anniversary of the Freshmen was celebrated in 1998 at a record-setting Society gathering back in Las Vegas. Another attendance record was set as we celebrated the sixtieth anniversary of the group in 2008 in Indianapolis. That year also marked the awarding of Honorary Doctor of Arts Degrees by Butler University to Ross Barbour and Bob Flanigan, then surviving members of the original Freshmen.

Over the years, Society members have enjoyed their close personal relationships with the past and present Freshmen groups and especially have appreciated the guys' wonderful performances at our annual gatherings. Such support is made possible by prudent management of the FFS treasury, under the current direction of FFS Treasurer John Emerson. Our financial resources are accumulated by membership dues, donations, CD sales, and positive balances from convention registrations.

From within our worldwide membership, countless stories about the FFS could be told. Hopefully, however, the above history will serve to enlighten our newest members and to refresh the memories of our long standing members as to what the Four Freshmen Society is all about. And just maybe you have a favorite FFS experience you'd like to share. If so, I encourage you to think about submitting your story for a future issue of Fresh News. It would be especially interesting to hear from anyone who has attended all 27 conventions! In he meanwhile, I hope you'll continue to support the FFS and the Freshmen whenever they appear in your area. And, of course, it's not too early to plan on attending the 2015 Convention, September 17-19, in San Antonio, Texas. I hope to see you there.

REINCARNATION OF FRANKLIN CD AT THE METROPOLIS

The essence of the Live at the Franklin (Tennessee) Theater CD (the Four Freshmen's newest) came alive for the rockin' sold out audience at the 280-seat Metropolis Theater in downtown Arlington Heights, Illinois on Saturday evening, June 28, 2914.

The Franklin CD is the first to introduce freshman Freshmen Stein (pronounced Stain) Malvey to the Freshmen afficionados. As you "now know," Stein sings the second vocal and plays a compelling lead guitar. As a surprise for him, his favorite Ohio cousins clapped their praises from the audience. As a surprise for them, they discovered his virtuosity. (After the concert, the cousins told this Freshmen Society member they were aware Stein was a gifted guitarist since junior high. But they didn't know, he could sing!)

The 24-tune set list featured an even split of 12 songs in the first half and 12 in the last. The list was intersected by a lucrative intermission for the group. At the break, the CD and DVD sales were particularly brisk because of a pricing incentive. The initial purchase was priced at \$20. The second or more purchases were \$10 apiece.

New to this writer was Brian Eichenberger's solo on the classic Hank Williams honky tonk ballad *Cold*, *Cold Heart*. Warm receptions were given for Bob Ferreira's brush-smacks on the drum head and high hat on *Rain*, *Another You*, and particularly *Pick Up Your Tears*. Curtis Calderon commanded the room with his customary flugelhorn and trumpet solos following the group's initial 32-bar renditions of *Route 66*, *Day by Day*, *Charmaine* and FF goldens and homage to the Freshmen originals. At the close, the Freshmen were given a standing ovation.

Why it took ten years for the four to make a return appearance at The Metropolis is anyone's guess. (This writer had been approaching the theater booker for years.)


