It makes you wonder what Bob Flanigan and Ross Barbour went through when they burned their frequent flyer cards. Ross said there is life after the Freshmen, so I'm going to have faith in one who knows. I know I'm busy and I guess that's a start.

For those of you who are interested, my day goes like this: I teach brass students at the various high schools in the area during the mornings, program and announce a jazz radio show at KRML ("Play Misty For Me") in Carmel from noon to 2 pm M-F, write arrangements for the rest of the afternoon, and occasionally gig at night. version of "Young & Foolish" as an opener, and I've got "The Touch of Your Lips" and Bobby Troup's "Away, Away, Away" waiting in the wings. Brian, Bob, Vince and Curtis are actively acquiring material for the next recording and I'm happy to contribute whatever they may want.

Which brings up Group #22: Curtis, Curtis, Curtis! (Sorry, I just had a "Jan Brady moment.") I'll just repeat what I said at the convention about him: I absolutely hate his guts. Not only does he have the best soloing concepts since Ken Albers, he has the nerve to be a great guy at the same time. For this, I hate.....Seriously, though, Curt and I hit it off to the point that he actually said to me "It's a shame you have to go," as if to say that it would have been fun working together. But really, I'm just glad I could get out of the way so he could come in. The level of musicianship in this current group is the highest yet. Period. It takes serious time and rehearsal to be anywhere near the Capitol Freshmen groups, but in time they will. The combination of their youth, talent, and energy along with the serious management of IVI should mean great things in the future.
