When you buy your copy of the Freshmen's latest CD, consider purchasing additional copies as well. For example, consider donating one or more copies to your local library system (and get a tax deduction for the donation). This is one good way to get more people aware of the Freshmen and just how good they are. The hope is that when they hear the CD, they'll want to purchase their own copy.

If these will be your first donations, you might want to check with your library about their donation policies first. Letting them know that the Freshmen have won the Downbeat magazine Vocal Group of the Year the last two years and have been inducted into the Vocal Group Hall of Fame should help answer any questions they may have.

Consider checking with your local school music departments and libraries to find out their donation policies. There are enough young people who would love this music if they only had easy access to it. And how about copies for other family members, neighbors, co-workers and friends?

Donate one or more CD's as a door prize to be given away by a group to which you belong. You'll help both the Freshmen and your own organization with just one donation.

Check with the hosts of local radio programs that air Four Freshmen cuts or similar music and ask if you can donate a copy to them for possible airplay.

Whether you buy one or more copies, please post online reviews of the CD at a variety of Web sites that encourage visitors to do just that for CD's they sell. Your favorable comments may well convince others to purchase the CD for themselves.
